Synonyms of "Glaring" as an adjective (23 Words)

<u>blatant</u>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i>Despite their blatant attraction to each other they try to stay just friends.</i>
<u>blazing</u>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>The blazing sun.</i>
<u>blinding</u>	Shining intensely. <i>Blinding headlights.</i>
<u>conspicuous</u>	Clearly visible. <i>He was very thin with a conspicuous Adam s apple.</i>
crying	Very great. <i>A crying need.</i>
<u>dazzling</u>	Extremely impressive, beautiful, or skilful. <i>The skater s dazzling virtuosic leaps.</i>
egregious	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Egregious abuses of copyright.</i>
flagrant	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A flagrant violation of the law.</i>
fulgent	Shining intensely. <i>Fulgent patterns of sunlight.</i>
glary	Shining intensely.
gross	(of a score in golf) as actually played, without taking handicap into account. <i>The gross amount of the gift was 1 000.</i>
harsh	Sharply disagreeable; rigorous. <i>Had harsh words.</i>
<u>inescapable</u>	Unable to be avoided or denied. <i>They came to the inescapable conclusion that he was responsible.</i>
obtrusive	Noticeable or prominent in an unwelcome or intrusive way. <i>Equally obtrusive was the graffiti.</i>
obvious	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was obvious a storm was coming in.</i>
<u>outrageous</u>	Very bold and unusual and rather shocking. <i>Her outrageous leotards and sexy routines.</i>
plain to see	Lacking in physical beauty or proportion.

rank	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>Rank earth.</i>
staring someone in the face	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. (of an employee) on strike. <i>The murder bore a striking similarity to an earlier shooting.</i>
striking	
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Despite his strong constitution constant worry and exposure to the elements had worn him down.</i>
unmissable	So clear or obvious that it cannot be missed. <i>An unmissable target.</i>
unmistakable	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>

Associations of "Glaring" (30 Words)

- apparent** Appearing as such but not necessarily so.
*The committee investigated some **apparent** discrepancies.*
- blatant** Completely lacking in subtlety; very obvious.
***Blatant** radios.*
- brazen** Made of or resembling brass (as in color or hardness).
*He went about his illegal business with a **brazen** assurance.*
- clear** Make clear bright light or translucent.
*Was now **clear** of the charge of cowardice.*
- conspicuous** Obvious to the eye or mind.
*Made herself **conspicuous** by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- dazzling** Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning.
*A **dazzling** smile.*

detectable	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>There is a detectable note of bitterness when he talks of his father.</i>
discernible	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>Things happen in the earth and sky with no discernible cause.</i>
effulgence	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
egregious	Remarkably good. <i>Egregious abuses of copyright.</i>
emblazon	Depict (a heraldic device) on something. <i>Their success was emblazoned.</i>
evident	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i>Evident hostility.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>Flagrant violation of human rights.</i>
glaringly	In a glaring manner. <i>The reason was glaringly obvious.</i>
impressive	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>An impressive view of the mountains.</i>
manifest	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Her manifest charm and proven ability.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A marked increase in UK sales.</i>
noticeable	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A noticeable increase in staff motivation.</i>
notorious	Known widely and usually unfavorably. <i>Los Angeles is notorious for its smog.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
opalescent	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky opalescent or opaline luster.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
particularly	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i>Particularly able students.</i>
perspicuity	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
preeminent	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A preeminent archeologist.</i>

- pronounced** Strongly marked; easily noticeable.
*A **pronounced** flavor of cinnamon.*
- seemingly** From appearances alone-Thomas.
*A **seemingly** competent and well organized person.*
- unambiguous** Not open to more than one interpretation.
*As a horror apartheid is absolutely **unambiguous**.*
- visible** Visible imports or exports.
*A **visible** change of expression.*
- vociferous** Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry.
*He was a **vociferous** opponent of the takeover.*
