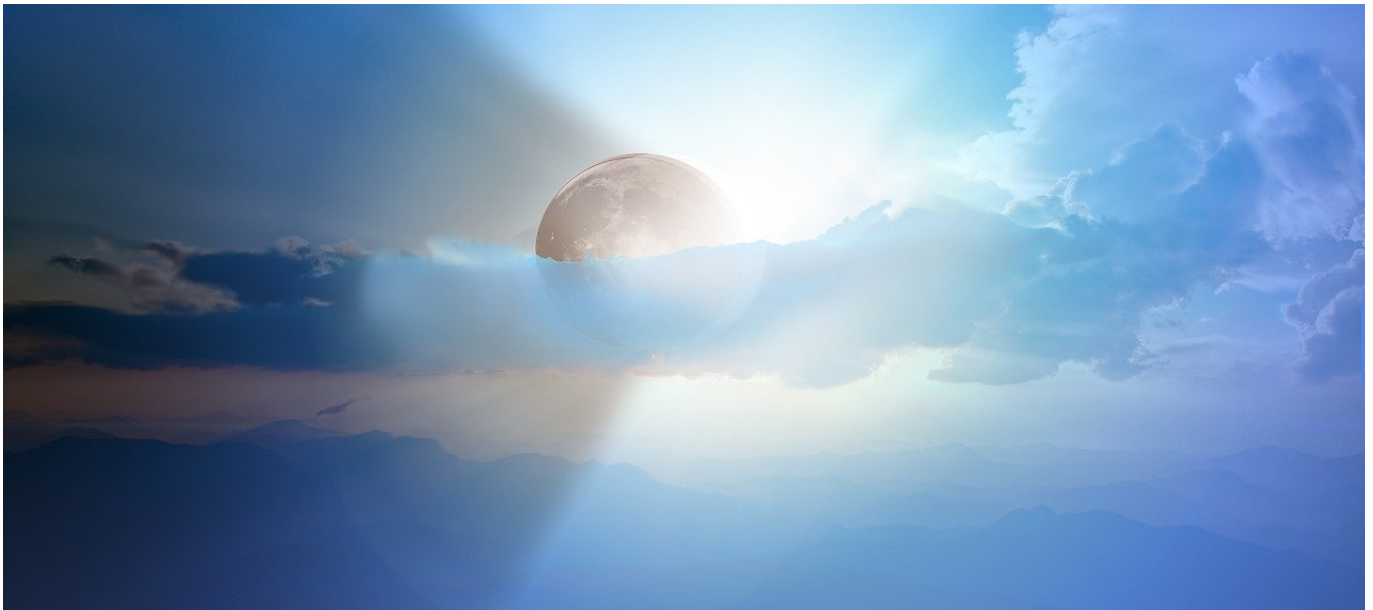
- *Giving out or reflecting a strong or dazzling light.*

## Synonyms of "Glaring" as an adjective (23 Words)

<b><u>blatant</u></b>	Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry. <i>Despite their <b>blatant</b> attraction to each other they try to stay just friends.</i>
<b><u>blazing</u></b>	Without any attempt at concealment; completely obvious. <i>The <b>blazing</b> sun.</i>
<b><u>blinding</u></b>	Shining intensely. <i><b>Blinding</b> headlights.</i>
<b><u>conspicuous</u></b>	Clearly visible. <i>He was very thin with a <b>conspicuous</b> Adam s apple.</i>
<b>crying</b>	Very great. <i>A <b>crying</b> need.</i>
<b><u>dazzling</u></b>	Extremely impressive, beautiful, or skilful. <i>The skater s <b>dazzling</b> virtuosic leaps.</i>
<b>egregious</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i><b>Egregious</b> abuses of copyright.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i>A <b>flagrant</b> violation of the law.</i>
<b>fulgent</b>	Shining intensely. <i><b>Fulgent</b> patterns of sunlight.</i>
<b>glary</b>	Shining intensely.
<b>gross</b>	(of a score in golf) as actually played, without taking handicap into account. <i>The <b>gross</b> amount of the gift was 1 000.</i>
<b>harsh</b>	Sharply disagreeable; rigorous. <i>Had <b>harsh</b> words.</i>
<b><u>inescapable</u></b>	Unable to be avoided or denied. <i>They came to the <b>inescapable</b> conclusion that he was responsible.</i>
<b>obtrusive</b>	Noticeable or prominent in an unwelcome or intrusive way. <i>Equally <b>obtrusive</b> was the graffiti.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Predictable and lacking in subtlety. <i>It was <b>obvious</b> a storm was coming in.</i>
<b><u>outrageous</u></b>	Very bold and unusual and rather shocking. <i>Her <b>outrageous</b> leotards and sexy routines.</i>
<b>plain to see</b>	Lacking in physical beauty or proportion.

<b>rank</b>	Conspicuously and outrageously bad or reprehensible. <i><b>Rank</b> earth.</i>
<b>staring someone in the face</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. (of an employee) on strike. <i>The murder bore a <b>striking</b> similarity to an earlier shooting.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Despite his <b>strong</b> constitution constant worry and exposure to the elements had worn him down.</i>
<b>unmissable</b>	So clear or obvious that it cannot be missed. <i>An <b>unmissable</b> target.</i>
<b>unmistakable</b>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>His opposition to slavery was <b>unmistakable</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Glaring" (30 Words)

- apparent**      Appearing as such but not necessarily so.  
*The committee investigated some **apparent** discrepancies.*
- blatant**        Completely lacking in subtlety; very obvious.  
***Blatant** radios.*
- brazen**         Made of or resembling brass (as in color or hardness).  
*He went about his illegal business with a **brazen** assurance.*
- clear**            Make clear bright light or translucent.  
*Was now **clear** of the charge of cowardice.*
- conspicuous**    Obvious to the eye or mind.  
*Made herself **conspicuous** by her exhibitionistic preening.*
- dazzling**        Amazingly impressive; suggestive of the flashing of lightning.  
*A **dazzling** smile.*

<b>detectable</b>	Able to be discovered or identified. <i>There is a <b>detectable</b> note of bitterness when he talks of his father.</i>
<b>discernible</b>	Able to be discerned; perceptible. <i>Things happen in the earth and sky with no <b>discernible</b> cause.</i>
<b>effulgence</b>	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
<b>egregious</b>	Remarkably good. <i><b>Egregious</b> abuses of copyright.</i>
<b>emblazon</b>	Depict (a heraldic device) on something. <i>Their success was <b>emblazoned</b>.</i>
<b>evident</b>	Clearly seen or understood; obvious. <i><b>Evident</b> hostility.</i>
<b>flagrant</b>	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i><b>Flagrant</b> violation of human rights.</i>
<b>glaringly</b>	In a glaring manner. <i>The reason was <b>glaringly</b> obvious.</i>
<b>impressive</b>	Making a strong or vivid impression. <i>An <b>impressive</b> view of the mountains.</i>
<b>manifest</b>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Her <b>manifest</b> charm and proven ability.</i>
<b>marked</b>	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A <b>marked</b> increase in UK sales.</i>
<b>noticeable</b>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>A <b>noticeable</b> increase in staff motivation.</i>
<b>notorious</b>	Known widely and usually unfavorably. <i>Los Angeles is <b>notorious</b> for its smog.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an <b>obvious</b> remark to make.</i>
<b>opalescent</b>	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>A milky <b>opalescent</b> or opaline luster.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>particularly</b>	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i><b>Particularly</b> able students.</i>
<b>perspicuity</b>	Clarity as a consequence of being perspicuous.
<b>preeminent</b>	Greatest in importance or degree or significance or achievement. <i>A <b>preeminent</b> archeologist.</i>

- pronounced** Strongly marked; easily noticeable.  
*A **pronounced** flavor of cinnamon.*
- seemingly** From appearances alone-Thomas.  
*A **seemingly** competent and well organized person.*
- unambiguous** Not open to more than one interpretation.  
*As a horror apartheid is absolutely **unambiguous**.*
- visible** Visible imports or exports.  
*A **visible** change of expression.*
- vociferous** Conspicuously and offensively loud; given to vehement outcry.  
*He was a **vociferous** opponent of the takeover.*
