Glazed as an Adjective

Definitions of "Glazed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “glazed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of food, fabric, etc.) overlaid or covered with a smooth, shiny coating or finish.*
- *(of a person's eyes or expression) showing no interest or animation.*
- *(of a window or door frame or similar structure) fitted with panes of glass.*
- *(used of eyes) lacking liveliness.*
- *Fitted or covered with glass.*
- *(of foods) covered with a shiny coating by applying e.g. beaten egg or a sugar or gelatin mixture.*
- *Having a shiny surface or coating.*

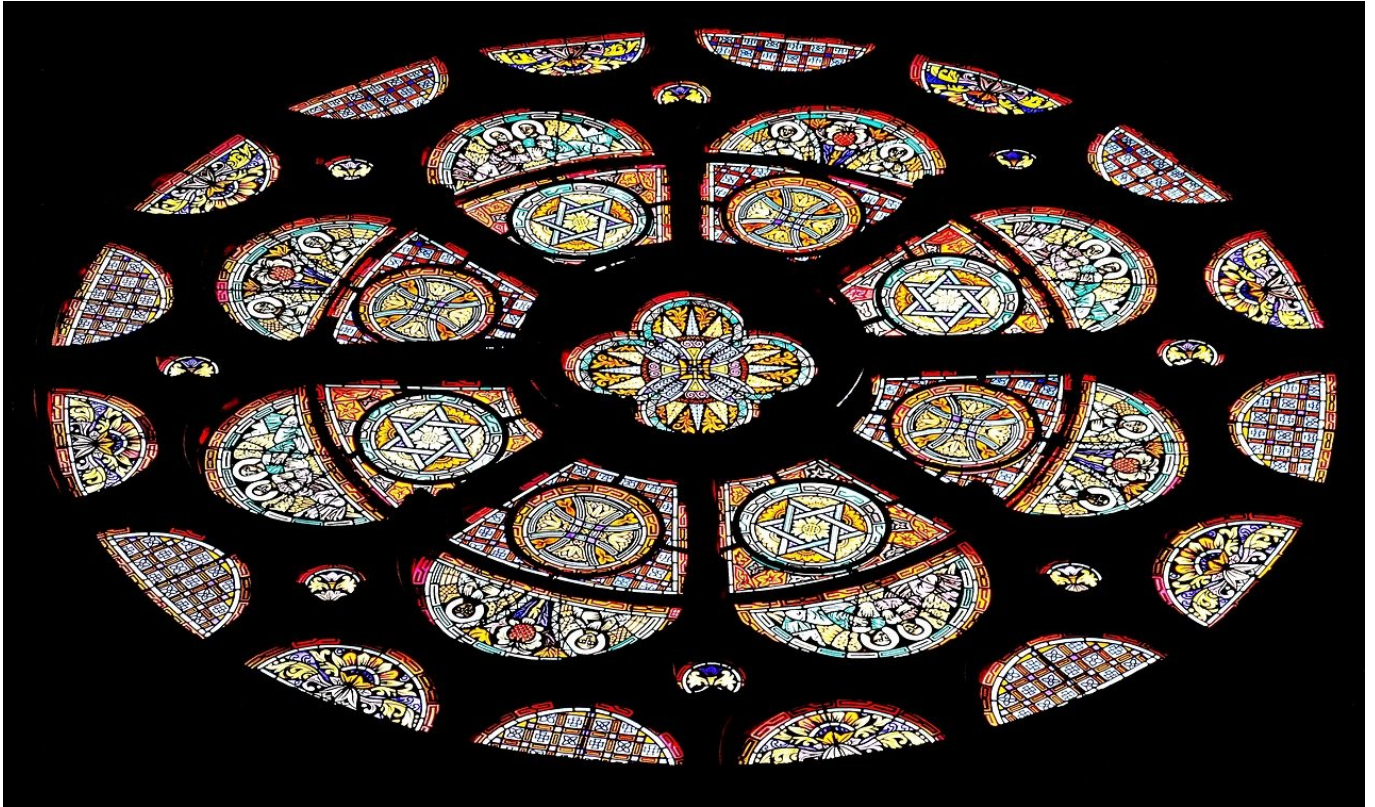


Synonyms of "Glazed" as an adjective (3 Words)

glassed Fitted or covered with glass.

glassy Having the surface made shiny and nonporous by fusing a vitreous solution to it.
*A **glassy** stare.*

shiny Having a shiny surface or coating.
*Saw the moon like a **shiny** dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.*

Associations of "Glazed" (30 Words)

bright	Brightly. <i>The windows glowed jewel bright.</i>
brilliance	Exceptional talent or intelligence. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the brilliance of Aegean stars.</i>
brilliantly	In an extremely intelligent way. <i>The stars shone brilliantly.</i>
candy	Sugar crystallized by repeated boiling and slow evaporation. <i>People sat eating popcorn and candy.</i>
dazzling	Shining intensely. <i>A dazzling display of football.</i>
enamel	Coat or decorate a metallic or hard object with enamel. <i>One coat of enamel and three coats of varnish.</i>
garish	Obtrusively bright and showy; lurid. <i>Garish colors.</i>

gleaming	Bright with a steady but subdued shining. <i>The gleaming brass on the altar.</i>
glistening	Shining with a sparkling light. <i>The glistening golden dome.</i>
gloss	Give a shine or gloss to usually by rubbing. <i>Beneath the gloss of success was a tragic private life.</i>
glossy	A photograph printed on glossy paper. <i>Thick glossy manageable hair.</i>
glowing	Highly enthusiastic. <i>He received a glowing report from his teachers.</i>
illumine	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
lacquer	The sap of the lacquer tree used as a varnish. <i>A lacquer box.</i>
lambent	Softly bright or radiant. <i>Lambent tongues of flame.</i>
luminosity	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity.</i>
luminous	Softly bright or radiant. <i>A luminous glow.</i>
lustrous	Brilliant. <i>Lustrous actors of the time.</i>
opacity	Incomprehensibility resulting from obscurity of meaning. <i>Thinner paints need black added to increase opacity.</i>
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
opalescent	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>An opalescent sky.</i>
polish	A preparation used in polishing. <i>His poetry has clarity and polish.</i>
polished	(of grains especially rice) having the husk or outer layers removed. <i>He was polished and charming.</i>
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>Don't assume that you should stare toward the radiant to see the most meteors.</i>

- sheen** The visual property of something that shines with reflected light.
*Black crushed velvet with a slight **sheen**.*
- shine** Make a surface shine.
*Archie s shoes got a quick **shine** from a boy with a cloth.*
- shining** Giving out or reflecting bright light.
*A **shining** example.*
- shiny** Having a shiny surface or coating.
***Shiny** hair.*
- thinner** A diluting agent.
*Dampen a clean rag with **thinners** and carefully wipe any remaining dust from the timber.*
- varnish** Cover with varnish.
*Her toenails were **varnished** red.*
