## Glazed as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Glazed" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “glazed” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(of food, fabric, etc.) overlaid or covered with a smooth, shiny coating or finish.*
- *(of a person's eyes or expression) showing no interest or animation.*
- *(of a window or door frame or similar structure) fitted with panes of glass.*
- *(used of eyes) lacking liveliness.*
- *Fitted or covered with glass.*
- *(of foods) covered with a shiny coating by applying e.g. beaten egg or a sugar or gelatin mixture.*
- *Having a shiny surface or coating.*

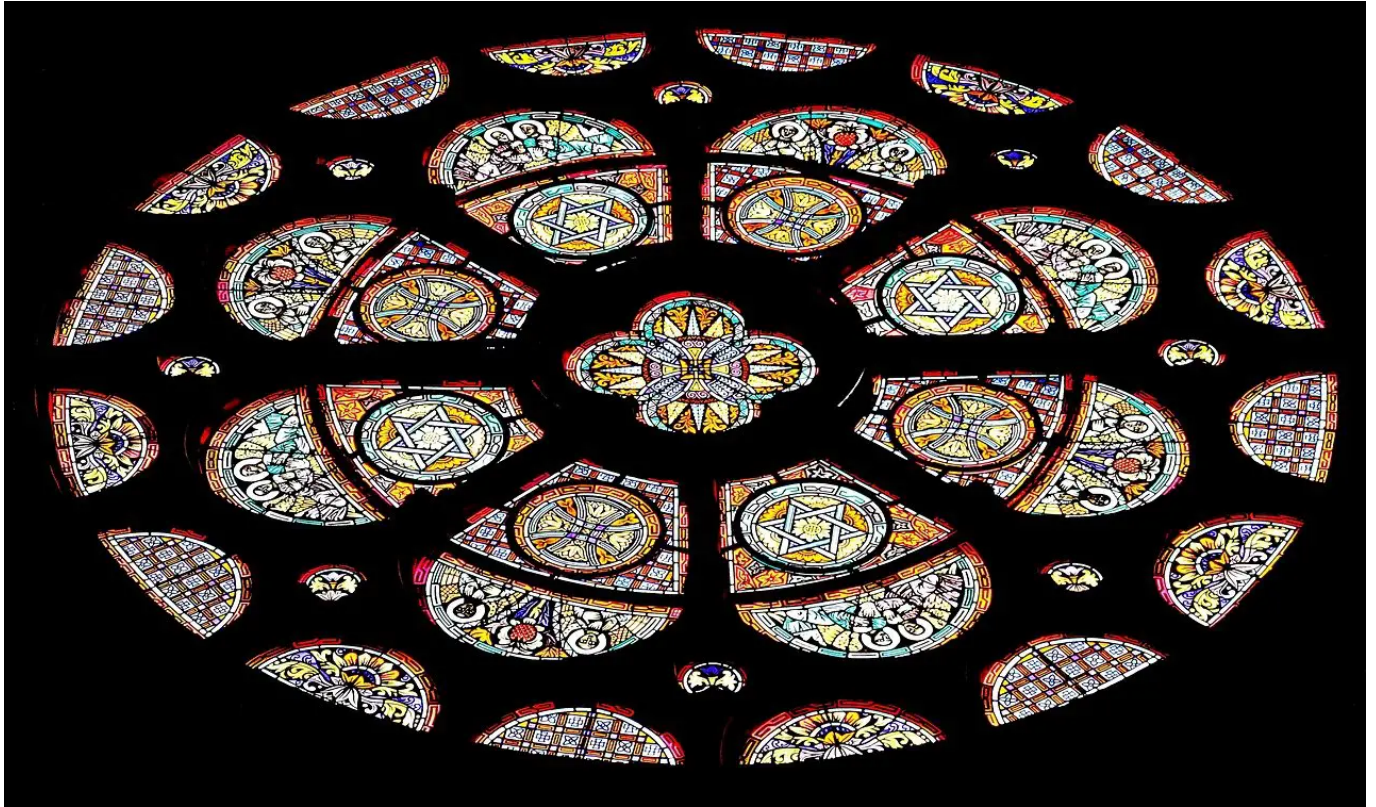


### Synonyms of "Glazed" as an adjective (3 Words)

**glassed** Fitted or covered with glass.

**glassy** Having the surface made shiny and nonporous by fusing a vitreous solution to it.  
A **glassy** stare.

**shiny** Having a shiny surface or coating.  
Saw the moon like a **shiny** dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.



## Usage Examples of "Glazed" as an adjective

- A *glazed* ham.
- A large *glazed* urn.
- His eyes were *glazed over* with boredom.
- *Glazed* shallots.
- *Glazed* fabrics.
- *Glazed* doughnuts.
- She had a *glazed* look in her eyes.
- Bookcases with *glazed* doors.
- Four *glazed* walls.





## Associations of "Glazed" (30 Words)

<b>bright</b>	Brightly. <i>The windows glowed jewel <b>bright</b>.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	Exceptional talent or intelligence. <i>The nights were dark lit only by the <b>brilliance</b> of Aegean stars.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	In an extremely intelligent way. <i>The stars shone <b>brilliantly</b>.</i>
<b>candy</b>	Sugar crystallized by repeated boiling and slow evaporation. <i>People sat eating popcorn and <b>candy</b>.</i>
<b>dazzling</b>	Shining intensely. <i>A <b>dazzling</b> display of football.</i>
<b>enamel</b>	Coat or decorate a metallic or hard object with enamel. <i>One coat of <b>enamel</b> and three coats of varnish.</i>
<b>garish</b>	Obtrusively bright and showy; lurid. <i><b>Garish</b> colors.</i>

<b>gleaming</b>	Bright with a steady but subdued shining. <i>The <b>gleaming</b> brass on the altar.</i>
<b>glistening</b>	Shining with a sparkling light. <i>The <b>glistening</b> golden dome.</i>
<b>gloss</b>	Give a shine or gloss to usually by rubbing. <i>Beneath the <b>gloss</b> of success was a tragic private life.</i>
<b>glossy</b>	A photograph printed on glossy paper. <i>Thick <b>glossy</b> manageable hair.</i>
<b>glowing</b>	Highly enthusiastic. <i>He received a <b>glowing</b> report from his teachers.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Enlighten (someone) spiritually or intellectually. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>lacquer</b>	The sap of the lacquer tree used as a varnish. <i>A <b>lacquer</b> box.</i>
<b>lambent</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i><b>Lambent</b> tongues of flame.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The intrinsic brightness of a celestial object (as distinct from its apparent brightness diminished by distance). <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>luminous</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>A <b>luminous</b> glow.</i>
<b>lustrous</b>	Brilliant. <i><b>Lustrous</b> actors of the time.</i>
<b>opacity</b>	Incomprehensibility resulting from obscurity of meaning. <i>Thinner paints need black added to increase <b>opacity</b>.</i>
<b>opalescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>opalescent</b>	Having a play of lustrous rainbow colors. <i>An <b>opalescent</b> sky.</i>
<b>polish</b>	A preparation used in polishing. <i>His poetry has clarity and <b>polish</b>.</i>
<b>polished</b>	(of grains especially rice) having the husk or outer layers removed. <i>He was <b>polished</b> and charming.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>Don't assume that you should stare toward the <b>radiant</b> to see the most meteors.</i>



<b>sheen</b>	The visual property of something that shines with reflected light. <i>Black crushed velvet with a slight <b>sheen</b>.</i>
<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>Archie s shoes got a quick <b>shine</b> from a boy with a cloth.</i>
<b>shining</b>	Giving out or reflecting bright light. <i>A <b>shining</b> example.</i>
<b>shiny</b>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i><b>Shiny</b> hair.</i>
<b>thinner</b>	A diluting agent. <i>Dampen a clean rag with <b>thinners</b> and carefully wipe any remaining dust from the timber.</i>
<b>varnish</b>	Cover with varnish. <i>Her toenails were <b>varnished</b> red.</i>
