## **Glean as a Verb**

### **Definitions of "Glean" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “glean” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Gather (leftover grain) after a harvest.*
- *Collect gradually.*
- *Obtain (information) from various sources, often with difficulty.*
- *Gather, as of natural products.*



## Synonyms of "Glean" as a verb (14 Words)

**bring in** Bring into a different state.

**cull** Look for and gather.  
*Anecdotes **culled** from Greek and Roman history.*

**derive** Come from; be connected by a relationship of blood, for example.  
*The present name **derives** from an older form.*

**draw** Represent by making a drawing of as with a pencil chalk etc on a surface.  
*The session was **drawn** to a close.*

**extract** Extract by the process of distillation.  
*Early computers had an instruction to **extract** a square root.*

**garner** Assemble or get together.  
*The police struggled to **garner** sufficient evidence.*

**gather** Collect or gather.  
*She lay **gathering** her thoughts together.*

**gather in** Collect or gather.

- get** Take vengeance on or get even.  
*Let s **get** you home.*
- harvest** Gather a crop as a harvest.  
*The research teams are leading the way in identifying new ways of **harvesting** the sun s energy.*
- obtain** Receive a specified treatment (abstract).  
*Adequate insurance cover is difficult to **obtain**.*
- reap** Get or derive.  
*In terms of science the Apollo programme **reaped** a meagre harvest.*
- take** Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes.  
*Everything you say he **takes** it the wrong way.*
- take in** Take into consideration for exemplifying purposes.



## Usage Examples of "Glean" as a verb

- *The conditions of farm workers in the 1890s made gleaning essential.*
- *The information is gleaned from press cuttings.*

- *Objects gleaned from local markets.*



## Associations of "Glean" (30 Words)

<b>acquire</b>	Gain knowledge or skills. <i>He <b>acquired</b> a reputation for scrupulous honesty.</i>
<b>acquired</b>	Gotten through environmental forces. <i><b>Acquired</b> characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
<b>achievement</b>	Something acquired, typically a skill. <i>The <b>achievement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>There were many <b>acquisitions</b> among travel agents.</i>
<b>aggregation</b>	The formation of a number of things into a cluster. <i>A single dose of aspirin irreversibly inhibits the normal <b>aggregation</b> of platelets.</i>
<b>attainable</b>	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>An <b>attainable</b> target.</i>

<b>collate</b>	Compare critically; of texts. <i>These accounts he <b>collated</b> with his own experience.</i>
<b>collect</b>	Gather or collect. <i>A small crowd <b>collected</b> at the back door.</i>
<b>cumulate</b>	An igneous rock formed by gravitational settling of particles in a magma. <i>All unpaid dividend payments <b>cumulate</b> and are paid when earnings are sufficient.</i>
<b>derive</b>	Obtain something from (a specified source). <i>The volume fraction of the soil can then be <b>derived</b> as a function of L.</i>
<b><u>earn</u></b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>He <b>earns</b> his living as a lorry driver.</i>
<b>gain</b>	(of a clock or watch) become fast by (a specific amount of time). <i>To gratify the queen and <b>gain</b> the court.</i>
<b><u>garner</u></b>	Assemble or get together. <i>The crop was ready to be reaped and <b>garnered</b>.</i>
<b><u>gather</u></b>	Collect or gather. <i>She paused to <b>gather</b> her breath and leaned against the wall puffing.</i>
<b>get</b>	Take vengeance on or get even. <i><b>Get</b> the form signed by a doctor.</i>
<b>harvest</b>	Gather a crop as a harvest. <i>After <b>harvesting</b> most of the crop is stored in large buildings.</i>
<b><u>incur</u></b>	Make oneself subject to; bring upon oneself; become liable to. <i>I will pay any expenses <b>incurred</b>.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Come into possession of. <i>The price of silver fell to that <b>obtaining</b> elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Able to be obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>He <b>procured</b> his wife to sign the mandate for the joint account.</i>
<b><u>procurement</u></b>	The action of obtaining or procuring something. <i>Financial assistance for the <b>procurement</b> of legal advice.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Something acquired by purchase. <i>She stowed her <b>purchases</b> in the car.</i>
<b>reap</b>	Cut or gather (a crop or harvest). <i>Many men were employed to <b>reap</b> the harvest.</i>
<b>reaper</b>	Someone who helps to gather the harvest.

- regain** Get or find back; recover the use of.  
*He soon **regained** his composure.*
- retrieval** The action of obtaining or consulting material stored in a computer system.  
*Storage and **retrieval** systems.*
- scythe** Cut with a scythe.  
*The first job was to **scythe** paths through the nettles.*
- secure** Financially sound.  
*His position as party leader was less than **secure**.*
- wangle** An act or an instance of obtaining something by persuasion or clever manipulation.  
*A rather clever **wangle** on the part of some of the folk at the office.*
