<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. Saw the moon like a shiny dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.

iridescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
lucent	Glowing with or giving off light. The moon was lucent in the background.
luminosity	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. Acrylic colours retain freshness and luminosity .
luminous	Softly bright or radiant. A sky luminous with stars.
lustrous	Having lustre; shining. Large lustrous eyes.
opalescence	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
opalescent	Showing many small points of shifting colour against a pale or dark ground. <i>An opalescent sky.</i>
polish	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. He s got to polish up his French for his job.
<u>polished</u>	To trim and smooth. <i>He was polished and charming.</i>
radiance	A glowing quality of the skin, especially as indicative of good health or youth. <i>The radiance</i> of the sunset dwindled and died.
radiant	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. I sat down by my hissing gas fire one of the radiant s was missing.
sheen	The visual property of something that shines with reflected light. <i>Her black hair</i> sheen ed in the sun.



shine	Make a surface shine. My hair has lost its shine .
shining	Brilliant or excellent at something. Had shining virtues and few faults.
<u>shiny</u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. Saw the moon like a shiny dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.
<u>sleek</u>	Well-groomed and neatly tailored; especially too well-groomed. A sleek black cat.
<u>sparkle</u>	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. There was a sparkle in his eyes.
<u>sparkling</u>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. Her sparkling blue eyes.
<u>twinkle</u>	Smile so that one's eyes sparkle. Does a constellation twinkle more brightly than a single star.
