<b>gleaming</b>	Bright with a steady but subdued shining. <i><b>Gleaming</b> black limousines.</i>
<b>glossy</b>	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. <i><b>Glossy</b> paper.</i>
<b>iridescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>lucent</b>	Glowing with or giving off light. <i>The moon was <b>lucent</b> in the background.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	The rate of emission of radiation, visible or otherwise. <i>Acrylic colours retain freshness and <b>luminosity</b>.</i>
<b>luminous</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>A sky <b>luminous</b> with stars.</i>
<b>lustrous</b>	Having lustre; shining. <i>Large <b>lustrous</b> eyes.</i>
<b>opalescence</b>	The visual property of something having a milky brightness and a play of colors from the surface.
<b>opalescent</b>	Showing many small points of shifting colour against a pale or dark ground. <i>An <b>opalescent</b> sky.</i>
<b>polish</b>	Improve or perfect by pruning or polishing. <i>He s got to <b>polish</b> up his French for his job.</i>
<b>polished</b>	To trim and smooth. <i>He was <b>polished</b> and charming.</i>
<b>radiance</b>	A glowing quality of the skin, especially as indicative of good health or youth. <i>The <b>radiance</b> of the sunset dwindled and died.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	Of an appliance designed to emit radiant energy especially for cooking or heating. <i>I sat down by my hissing gas fire one of the <b>radiants</b> was missing.</i>
<b>sheen</b>	The visual property of something that shines with reflected light. <i>Her black hair <b>sheened</b> in the sun.</i>

<b>shine</b>	Make a surface shine. <i>My hair has lost its <b>shine</b>.</i>
<b>shining</b>	Brilliant or excellent at something. <i>Had <b>shining</b> virtues and few faults.</i>
<b>shiny</b>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Saw the moon like a <b>shiny</b> dime on a deep blue velvet carpet.</i>
<b>sleek</b>	Well-groomed and neatly tailored; especially too well-groomed. <i>A <b>sleek</b> black cat.</i>
<b>sparkle</b>	Become bubbly or frothy or foaming. <i>There was a <b>sparkle</b> in his eyes.</i>
<b>sparkling</b>	Shining brightly with flashes of light. <i>Her <b>sparkling</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>twinkle</b>	Smile so that one's eyes sparkle. <i>Does a constellation <b>twinkle</b> more brightly than a single star.</i>
