- *Dwell on one's own success or another's misfortune with smugness or malignant pleasure.*
- *Gaze at or think about something with great self-satisfaction, gratification, or joy.*

<b>crow over</b>	Express pleasure verbally.
<b>delight in</b>	Take delight in.
<b>enjoy greatly</b>	Derive or receive pleasure from; get enjoyment from; take pleasure in.
<b>exult in</b>	To express great joy.
<b>glory in</b>	Rejoice proudly.
<b>rejoice in</b>	Be ecstatic with joy.
<b><a href="#">relish</a></b>	Make pleasant to the taste add relish to. <i>We did not <b>relish</b> the idea of a strike.</i>
<b>revel in</b>	Take delight in.
<b>take great pleasure in</b>	Experience or feel or submit to.
<b><a href="#">triumph</a></b>	Be ecstatic with joy. <i>She stopped <b>triumphing</b> over Mrs Ward s failure.</i>
<b>triumph over</b>	Prove superior.

<a href="#"><u>arrogant</u></a>	Having or showing feelings of unwarranted importance out of overbearing pride. <i>Arrogant claims.</i>
<b>arty</b>	Making a strong, affected, or pretentious display of being artistic or interested in the arts. <i>A very <b>arty</b> film.</i>
<b>brash</b>	Self-assertive in a rude, noisy, or overbearing way. <i>He was <b>brash</b> cocky and arrogant.</i>

<b>cocksure</b>	Confident in an excessive or arrogant way. <i>An arrogant and <b>cocksure</b> materialist.</i>

<a href="#"><u>condescending</u></a>	(used of behavior or attitude) characteristic of those who treat others with condescension. <i>She thought the teachers were arrogant and <b>condescending</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>glee</u></a>	Malicious satisfaction. <i>His face lit up with impish <b>glee</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>haughty</u></a>	Arrogantly superior and disdainful. <i><b>Haughty</b> aristocrats.</i>
<b>immodest</b>	Having or showing an exaggerated opinion of your importance, ability, etc. <i>Brash <b>immodest</b> boasting.</i>
<b>imperious</b>	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy. <i>His <b>imperious</b> demands.</i>
<a href="#"><u>insolent</u></a>	Unrestrained by convention or propriety- Los Angeles Times. <i>The modern world with its quick material successes and <b>insolent</b> belief in the boundless possibilities of progress.</i>
<b>insolently</b>	In an insolent manner.

<b>lordly</b>	Of or befitting a lord. <i>They were putting on <b>lordly</b> airs.</i>
<b>mirth</b>	Amusement, especially as expressed in laughter. <i>His six foot frame shook with <b>mirth</b>.</i>
<b>officious</b>	Intrusive in a meddling or offensive manner. <i>Bustling about self importantly making an <b>officious</b> nuisance of himself.</i>
<b><u>overbearing</u></b>	Having or showing arrogant superiority to and disdain of those one views as unworthy. <i>An <b>overbearing</b> ill tempered brute.</i>
<b>overweening</b>	Showing excessive confidence or pride. <i>No idea how <b>overweening</b> he would be.</i>
<b>pomposity</b>	The quality of being pompous; self-importance. <i>His reputation for arrogance and <b>pomposity</b>.</i>
<b>poseur</b>	A person who behaves affectedly in order to impress others.
<b><u>presumptuous</u></b>	Excessively forward. <i>I hope I won't be considered <b>presumptuous</b> if I offer some advice.</i>
<b>proud</b>	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i><b>Proud</b> parents.</i>
<b>revenge</b>	Inflict revenge on behalf of someone else. <i>Zimbabwe snatched the game 18 16 but the Spanish had their <b>revenge</b> later.</i>
<b>sneering</b>	Contemptuous or mocking. <i>It will take a concerted effort from many to lay off the <b>sneering</b> and try understanding.</i>
<b><u>snob</u></b>	A person regarded as arrogant and annoying. <i>A musical <b>snob</b>.</i>
<b><u>snobbish</u></b>	Relating to, characteristic of, or like a snob. <i>The writer takes a rather <b>snobbish</b> tone.</i>
<b>supercilious</b>	Behaving or looking as though one thinks one is superior to others. <i>Curled his lip in a <b>supercilious</b> smile.</i>
<b>superciliousness</b>	The trait of displaying arrogance by patronizing those considered inferior.
<b>taunt</b>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping. <i>You once <b>taunted</b> me <b>taunted</b> me with cowardice because I dared not face the world and conquer it.</i>
<b>vainglorious</b>	Feeling self-importance. <i>This <b>vainglorious</b> boast of personal infallibility.</i>
