<u>country</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The country's largest manufacturer.</i>
countrywide	Occurring or extending throughout a country or nation. <i>A countrywide fund raising campaign.</i>
east	Of or denoting the eastern part of a specified region town or country. <i>A factory in the east of the city.</i>
eastern	Of or characteristic of eastern regions of the United States. <i>Eastern cities.</i>
<u>endemic</u>	An endemic plant or animal. <i>Endemic malaria.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>A security light with a frosted glass globe.</i>
history	The past considered as a whole. <i>History takes the long view.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>Intercontinental exploration.</i>
internationally	In, between, or among many different nations. <i>She is internationally known.</i>
locally	In a way that applies or is only available for use in one part of a program. <i>Locally produced goods.</i>
nationally	With regard to a nation taken as a whole. <i>His watercolours have been exhibited nationally.</i>
occident	The hemisphere that includes North America and South America.
oneness	The state of being in harmony with someone or something. <i>Holding to the oneness of God the Father as the only God.</i>
<u>orient</u>	Situated in or belonging to the east oriental. <i>Market oriented economic reforms.</i>

oriental	(of a pearl or other jewel) orient. <i>Oriental</i> civilization.
pandemic	An outbreak of a pandemic disease. <i>Pandemic</i> diseases have occurred throughout history.
seismology	The branch of geology that studies earthquakes.
south	The southern part of England. The <i>south</i> entrance.
southeast	Coming from the southeast. <i>Southeasterly</i> breezes.
southern	Situated in or coming from regions of the south. The <i>southern</i> rural poor.
southwest	Coming from the southwest. The winds are <i>southwesterly</i> .
transnational	A multinational company. <i>Transnational</i> advertising agencies.
<u>traveled</u>	Traveled over or through sometimes used as a combining term. Well <i>traveled</i> people.
<u>universal</u>	A universal proposition. <i>Universal</i> chuck.
west	The region of the United States lying to the west of the Mississippi River. A patrol aimed to create a diversion to the <i>west</i> of the city.
<u>whole</u>	Acting together as a single undiversified whole. A <i>whole</i> loaf of bread.
world	The 3rd planet from the sun; the planet we live on. They had been brought up to regard France as a <i>world</i> power.
<u>worldwide</u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. A <i>worldwide</i> epidemic.
