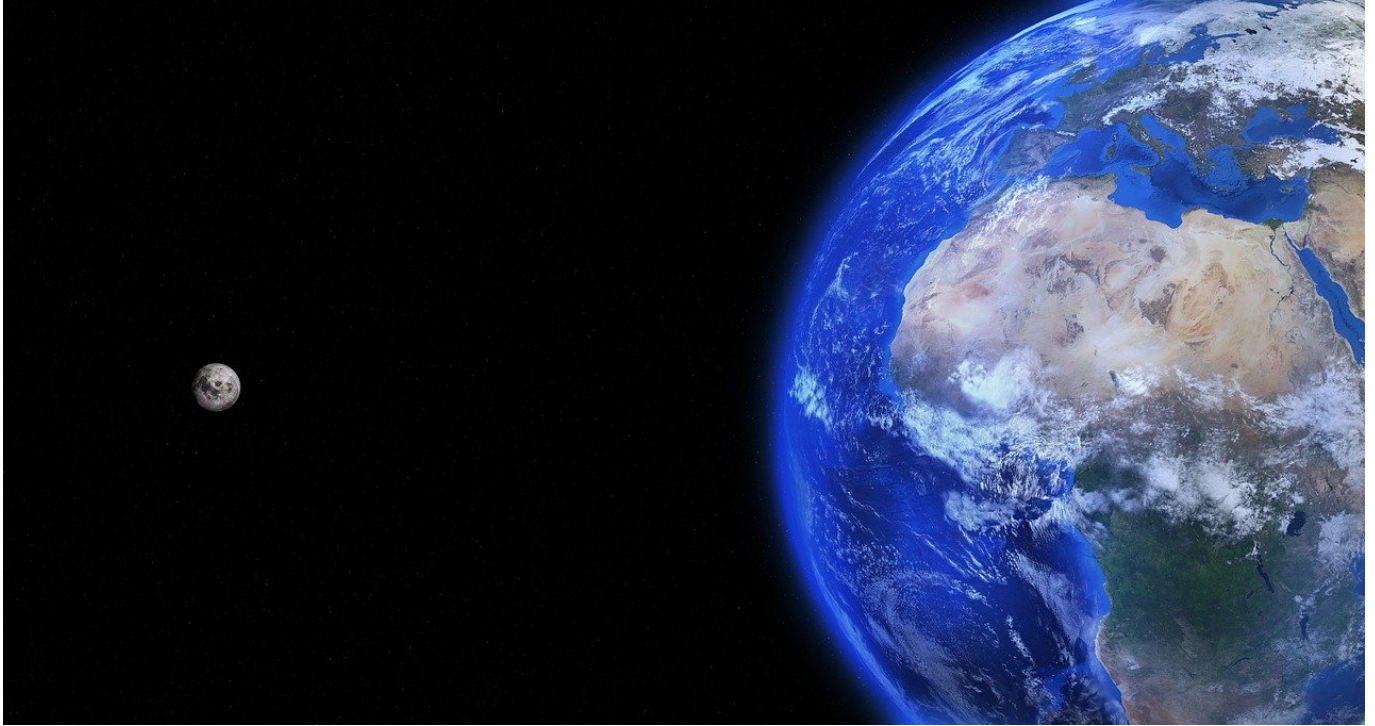
- *The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface.*

Synonyms of "Glowing" as an adjective (12 Words)

acclamatory	Relating to or expressing acclamation.
admiring	Characterized by or expressive of admiration or warm approval. <i>The snowman has drawn many an admiring glance from villagers.</i>
adulatory	Obsequiously complimentary. <i>An adulatory review.</i>
commendatory	Serving to present something as suitable for approval or acceptance. <i>A commendatory grin.</i>
ecstatic	Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence. <i>Ecstatic fans filled the stadium.</i>
enthusiastic	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>An enthusiastic response.</i>
eulogistic	Formally expressing praise.
full of praise	Being at a peak or culminating point.

laudatory	Full of or giving praise. <i>A laudatory remark.</i>
praising	Full of or giving praise.
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
rhapsodic	Feeling great rapture or delight.



Usage Examples of "Glowing" as an adjective

- *He received a glowing report from his teachers.*
- *Glowing praise.*

- beam** Express with a beaming face or smile.

- bright** Not made dim or less bright.
*A **bright** young journalist.*
- brilliance** The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand.
*His Hamlet lacks the **brilliance** that one expects.*
- brilliantly** With brightness.
*She succeeded **brilliantly**.*
- compliment** Politely congratulate or praise (someone) for something.
*The manager was heard to **compliment** the other team s good play.*

daytime	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside. <i>She was alone in the daytime.</i>
dazzle	(of a bright light) blind (a person or their eyes) temporarily. <i>I screwed my eyes up against the dazzle.</i>
dazzling	Shining intensely. <i>The sunlight was dazzling.</i>
esteem	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>He was held in high esteem by colleagues.</i>
fiery	Consisting of fire or burning strongly and brightly. <i>The sun was a fiery ball low on the hills.</i>
flash	A newsflash. <i>A flash car.</i>
glaze	Coat with a glaze. <i>The prospect makes my eyes glaze over with boredom.</i>
gleaming	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i>Gleaming black limousines.</i>
glossy	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. <i>Glossy paper.</i>
illumine	Make lighter or brighter. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
incandescent	Emitting light as a result of being heated. <i>Plumes of incandescent liquid rock.</i>
lambent	Softly bright or radiant. <i>His eyes were huge and lambent in his starved face.</i>
lucent	Glowing with or giving off light. <i>The lucent moon.</i>
luminescent	Emitting light not caused by heat. <i>There s something calming about watching a luminescent jellyfish.</i>
luminosity	Luminous quality. <i>Its luminosity is measured relative to that of our sun.</i>
luminous	Giving off light; bright or shining. <i>Her eyes were luminous with joy.</i>
lustrous	Having lustre; shining. <i>Lustrous auburn hair.</i>
praise	An expression of approval and commendation. <i>He always appreciated praise for his work.</i>

radiance	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>Restore your skin s natural radiance.</i>
radiant	A radiant point. <i>He praised her radiant self confidence.</i>
shining	The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it. <i>He has set a shining example with his model behaviour.</i>
shiny	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i>Shiny black patents.</i>
splendor	A quality that outshines the usual. <i>It is the university that gives the scene its stately splendor.</i>
sunshine	The rays of the sun. <i>We walked in the warm sunshine.</i>
