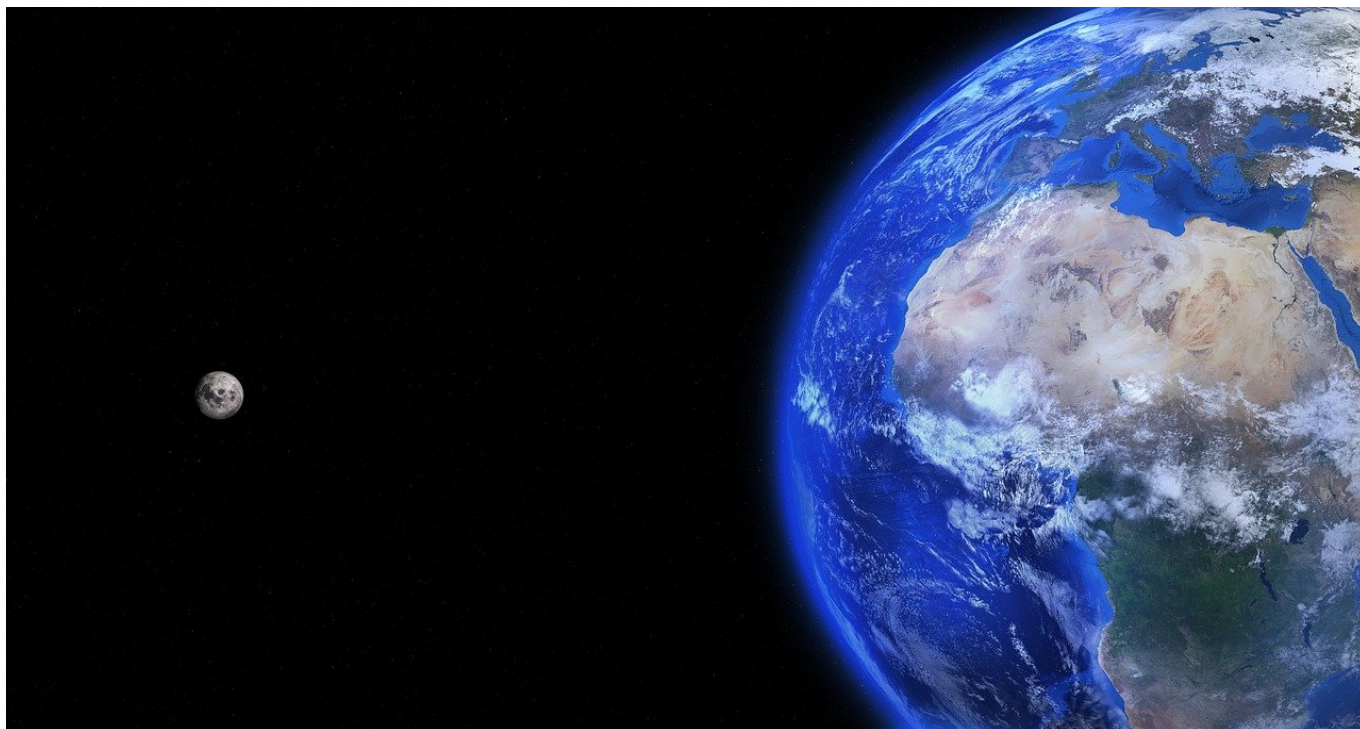
- *The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface.*

## Synonyms of "Glowing" as an adjective (12 Words)

<b>acclamatory</b>	Relating to or expressing acclamation.
<b>admiring</b>	Characterized by or expressive of admiration or warm approval. <i>The snowman has drawn many an <b>admiring</b> glance from villagers.</i>
<b>adulatory</b>	Obsequiously complimentary. <i>An <b>adulatory</b> review.</i>
<b>commendatory</b>	Serving to present something as suitable for approval or acceptance. <i>A <b>commendatory</b> grin.</i>
<b><u>ecstatic</u></b>	Involving an experience of mystic self-transcendence. <i><b>Ecstatic</b> fans filled the stadium.</i>
<b>enthusiastic</b>	Having or showing intense and eager enjoyment, interest, or approval. <i>An <b>enthusiastic</b> response.</i>
<b>eulogistic</b>	Formally expressing praise.
<b>full of praise</b>	Being at a peak or culminating point.



<b>laudatory</b>	Full of or giving praise. <i>A <b>laudatory</b> remark.</i>
<b>praising</b>	Full of or giving praise.
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rhapsodic</b>	Feeling great rapture or delight.



### Usage Examples of "Glowing" as an adjective

- *He received a glowing report from his teachers.*
- *Glowing praise.*

<b>admire</b>	Feel admiration for. <i>I <b>admire</b> your courage.</i>
<u><a href="#">beam</a></u>	Express with a beaming face or smile. <i>A cutter with a <b>beam</b> of 16 feet.</i>
<u><a href="#">bright</a></u>	Not made dim or less bright. <i>A <b>bright</b> young journalist.</i>
<b>brilliance</b>	The quality of being magnificent or splendid or grand. <i>His Hamlet lacks the <b>brilliance</b> that one expects.</i>
<b>brilliantly</b>	With brightness. <i>She succeeded <b>brilliantly</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">compliment</a></u>	Politely congratulate or praise (someone) for something. <i>The manager was heard to <b>compliment</b> the other team s good play.</i>

<b>daytime</b>	The time after sunrise and before sunset while it is light outside. <i>She was alone in the <b>daytime</b>.</i>
<b>dazzle</b>	(of a bright light) blind (a person or their eyes) temporarily. <i>I screwed my eyes up against the <b>dazzle</b>.</i>
<b>dazzling</b>	Shining intensely. <i>The sunlight was <b>dazzling</b>.</i>
<b>esteem</b>	The condition of being honored esteemed or respected or well regarded. <i>He was held in high <b>esteem</b> by colleagues.</i>
<b>fiery</b>	Consisting of fire or burning strongly and brightly. <i>The sun was a <b>fiery</b> ball low on the hills.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>A <b>flash</b> car.</i>
<b>glaze</b>	Coat with a glaze. <i>The prospect makes my eyes <b>glaze</b> over with boredom.</i>
<b>gleaming</b>	A flash of light (especially reflected light). <i><b>Gleaming</b> black limousines.</i>
<b>glossy</b>	Having a surface made smooth and glossy especially by pressing between rollers. <i><b>Glossy</b> paper.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Make lighter or brighter. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illuminated</b>.</i>
<b>incandescent</b>	Emitting light as a result of being heated. <i>Plumes of <b>incandescent</b> liquid rock.</i>
<b>lambent</b>	Softly bright or radiant. <i>His eyes were huge and <b>lambent</b> in his starved face.</i>
<b>lucent</b>	Glowing with or giving off light. <i>The <b>lucent</b> moon.</i>
<b>luminescent</b>	Emitting light not caused by heat. <i>There s something calming about watching a <b>luminescent</b> jellyfish.</i>
<b>luminosity</b>	Luminous quality. <i>Its <b>luminosity</b> is measured relative to that of our sun.</i>
<b>luminous</b>	Giving off light; bright or shining. <i>Her eyes were <b>luminous</b> with joy.</i>
<b>lustrous</b>	Having lustre; shining. <i><b>Lustrous</b> auburn hair.</i>
<b>praise</b>	An expression of approval and commendation. <i>He always appreciated <b>praise</b> for his work.</i>



<b>radiance</b>	The amount of electromagnetic radiation leaving or arriving at a point on a surface. <i>Restore your skin s natural <b>radiance</b>.</i>
<b>radiant</b>	A radiant point. <i>He praised her <b>radiant</b> self confidence.</i>
<b>shining</b>	The work of making something smooth and shiny by rubbing or waxing it. <i>He has set a <b>shining</b> example with his model behaviour.</i>
<u><b>shiny</b></u>	Having a shiny surface or coating. <i><b>Shiny</b> black patents.</i>
<u><b>splendor</b></u>	A quality that outshines the usual. <i>It is the university that gives the scene its stately <b>splendor</b>.</i>
<b>sunshine</b>	The rays of the sun. <i>We walked in the warm <b>sunshine</b>.</i>
