Glue as a Noun

Definitions of "Glue" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “glue” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *An adhesive substance used for sticking objects or materials together.*
- *Cement consisting of a sticky substance that is used as an adhesive.*



Synonyms of "Glue" as a noun (6 Words)

adhesive A substance used for sticking objects or materials together; glue.
*Tile **adhesive**.*

cement Concrete pavement is sometimes referred to as cement.
*Dental **cement**.*

fixative A liquid sprayed on to a pastel or charcoal drawing to fix colours or prevent smudging.
*An alcoholic **fixative**.*

gum A gum tree especially a eucalyptus.

mucilage A gelatinous substance secreted by plants.

paste A paste used as an adhesive especially for sticking paper.
*Blend onions sugar and oil to a **paste**.*

Glue as a Verb

Definitions of "Glue" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "glue" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Join or attach with or as if with glue.*
- *Fasten or join with or as if with glue.*
- *Be paying very close attention to (something, especially a television).*
- *Be fixed as if by glue.*



Synonyms of "Glue" as a verb (8 Words)

be gripped by	To remain unmolested, undisturbed, or uninterrupted — used only in infinitive form.
be hypnotized by	Be identical to; be someone or something.
be mesmerized by	Happen, occur, take place.
be riveted by	Be identical to; be someone or something.
be riveted to	Form or compose.
gum	Cover fill fix or smear with or as if with gum. <i>If you gum the tape it is stronger.</i>
paste	Coat with paste. <i>He pasted his opponent.</i>
stick	Stick to firmly. <i>Stick the poster onto the wall.</i>



Usage Examples of "Glue" as a verb

- *I was glued to the telly when the Olympics were on.*
- *The wood is cut into pieces which are then glued together.*
- *His eyes were glued on her.*



Associations of "Glue" (30 Words)

<u>adhere</u>	Be loyal to. <i>Will this wallpaper adhere to the wall.</i>
<u>adherence</u>	The quality or process of sticking fast to an object or surface. <i>Adherence to a fat free diet.</i>
<u>adhesion</u>	A fibrous band of scar tissue that binds together normally separate anatomical structures. <i>The adhesion of the gum strip to the paper.</i>
<u>adhesive</u>	Able to stick fast to a surface or object; sticky. <i>An adhesive label.</i>
attach	Become attached. <i>A good deal of prominence attaches to the central union federations.</i>
attachment	Temporary secondment to an organization. <i>The processor comes complete with a blender attachment.</i>

chew	Chew food to bite and grind with the teeth. <i>A chew of tobacco.</i>
chomp	Munch or chew noisily or vigorously. <i>The boy chomped his sandwich.</i>
embed	Place (a phrase or clause) within another clause or sentence. <i>The Victorian values embedded in Tennyson's poetry.</i>
epoxy	Glue with epoxy. <i>Epoxy the shards.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>The company is working on a fix but suggests users consider technical workarounds in the meantime.</i>
glutinous	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>Glutinous mud.</i>
gum	Wood or lumber from any of various gum trees especially the sweet gum. <i>The receipts are gummed into a special book.</i>
implant	Provide someone or something with something by implantation. <i>A silicone breast implant.</i>
incisor	A narrow edged tooth at the front of the mouth adapted for cutting In humans there are four incisors in each jaw.
mastication	Biting and grinding food in your mouth so it becomes soft enough to swallow.
mucous	Of or secreting or covered with or resembling mucus. <i>Mucous glands of the intestine.</i>
pitchy	Of the blackest black; similar to the color of jet or coal.
primer	A cap or cylinder containing a compound which responds to friction or an electrical impulse and ignites the charge in a cartridge or explosive. <i>Apply three coats of primer.</i>
<u>slimy</u>	Covered with or resembling slime. <i>Thick slimy mud.</i>
sticker	A short knife with a pointed blade used for piercing or stabbing. <i>Warning stickers on the glass.</i>
<u>sticky</u>	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive. <i>The dough should be moist but not sticky.</i>
<u>tacky</u>	(of glue, paint, or other substances) not fully dry and retaining a slightly sticky feel. <i>Tacky varnish.</i>
<u>tape</u>	Fasten or attach with tape. <i>A tape of a radio talk.</i>

taping	A recording made on magnetic tape.
	Something resembling the tooth of an animal.
tooth	<i>The paper used in copying machines is good as it has tooth and takes ink well.</i>
	Remove the tusks of animals.
tusk	<i>Tusk an elephant.</i>
	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.
viscid	<i>The viscid mucus lining of the intestine.</i>
	The state of being thick, sticky, and semi-fluid in consistency, due to internal friction.
<u>viscosity</u>	<i>Cooling the fluid raises its viscosity.</i>
	Having the sticky properties of an adhesive.
<u>viscous</u>	<i>Viscous lava.</i>
