<a href="#">across</a>	Transversely. <i>He looked <b>across</b> at me.</i>
<b>antipodal</b>	Diametrically opposed to. <i><b>Antipodal</b> points on a sphere.</i>
<a href="#">astray</a>	Far from the intended target. <i>We went <b>astray</b> but a man redirected us.</i>
<b>athwart</b>	So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>One table running <b>athwart</b> was all the room would hold.</i>
<b>bereavement</b>	The fact or condition of being bereaved. <i>There is no right way to experience <b>bereavement</b>.</i>
<a href="#">beyond</a>	At or to the further side of something. <i>The athletes are pushing themselves to their limits and <b>beyond</b>.</i>
<b>christendom</b>	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia.
<b>continuing</b>	Of long duration. <i>The act provided a <b>continuing</b> annual appropriation.</i>
<a href="#">cross</a>	Pass the ball across the field towards the centre when attacking. <i><b>Cross</b> a horse and a donkey.</i>
<a href="#">crossover</a>	A voter who is registered as a member of one political party but who votes in the primary of another party. <i>A <b>crossover</b> study.</i>
<b>decamp</b>	Leave a camp. <i>The armies of both chiefs had <b>decamped</b>.</i>
<a href="#">depart</a>	Move away from a place into another direction. <i>He <b>departed</b> from the precedent set by many.</i>
<a href="#">going</a>	Euphemistic expressions for death. <i>A <b>going</b> concern.</i>

<b><u>horizon</u></b>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>She wanted to leave home and broaden her <b>horizons</b>.</i>
<b>intercontinental</b>	Relating to or travelling between continents. <i><b>Intercontinental</b> flights.</i>
<b>intersect</b>	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>The area is <b>intersected</b> only by minor roads.</i>
<b>intertwine</b>	Connect or link (two or more things) closely. <i><b>Intertwined</b> hearts.</i>
<b>itinerate</b>	(especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty. <i>Regular use of <b>itinerating</b> magistrates was made.</i>
<b><u>migrate</u></b>	Move from one part of something to another. <i>Many Germans <b>migrated</b> to South America in the mid 19th century.</i>
<b>migration</b>	(chemistry) the nonrandom movement of an atom or radical from one place to another within a molecule. <i>There is virtually no cell <b>migration</b> in plants.</i>
<b>move</b>	Move so as to change position perform a nontranslational motion. <i>The <b>movement</b> of people from the farms to the cities.</i>
<b><u>pedestrian</u></b>	A person walking rather than travelling in a vehicle. <i>The road is so dangerous <b>pedestrians</b> avoid it.</i>
<b><u>road</u></b>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>They waited for a clear <b>road</b> at Hellifield Junction.</i>
<b>rood</b>	A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.
<b>route</b>	Send via a specific route. <i>The many <b>routes</b> to a healthier diet will be described.</i>
<b><u>transverse</u></b>	Situated or extending across something. <i>A <b>transverse</b> beam supports the dashboard.</i>
<b>travel</b>	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>The vessel had been <b>travelling</b> from Libya to Ireland.</i>
<b><u>traverse</u></b>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>They had been practising firing at multiple targets using the power <b>traverse</b>.</i>
<b>trip</b>	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>Somebody <b>tripped</b> the alarm.</i>
