athwart	So as to be perverse or contradictory. <i>One table running athwart was all the room would hold.</i>
bereavement	The fact or condition of being bereaved. <i>There is no right way to experience bereavement.</i>
beyond	At or to the further side of something. <i>The athletes are pushing themselves to their limits and beyond.</i>
christendom	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia.
continuing	Of long duration. <i>The act provided a continuing annual appropriation.</i>
cross	Pass the ball across the field towards the centre when attacking. <i>Cross a horse and a donkey.</i>
crossover	A voter who is registered as a member of one political party but who votes in the primary of another party. <i>A crossover study.</i>
decamp	Leave a camp. <i>The armies of both chiefs had decamped.</i>
depart	Move away from a place into another direction. <i>He departed from the precedent set by many.</i>
going	Euphemistic expressions for death. <i>A going concern.</i>

<u>horizon</u>	The great circle on the celestial sphere whose plane passes through the sensible horizon and the center of the Earth. <i>She wanted to leave home and broaden her horizons.</i>
intercontinental	Relating to or travelling between continents. <i>Intercontinental flights.</i>
intersect	Divide (something) by passing or lying across it. <i>The area is intersected only by minor roads.</i>
intertwine	Connect or link (two or more things) closely. <i>Intertwined hearts.</i>
itinerate	(especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
<u>migrate</u>	Move from one part of something to another. <i>Many Germans migrated to South America in the mid 19th century.</i>
migration	(chemistry) the nonrandom movement of an atom or radical from one place to another within a molecule. <i>There is virtually no cell migration in plants.</i>
move	Move so as to change position perform a nontranslational motion. <i>The movement of people from the farms to the cities.</i>
<u>pedestrian</u>	A person walking rather than travelling in a vehicle. <i>The road is so dangerous pedestrians avoid it.</i>
<u>road</u>	The part of a road intended for vehicles especially in contrast to a verge or pavement. <i>They waited for a clear road at Hellifield Junction.</i>
rood	A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>The many routes to a healthier diet will be described.</i>
<u>transverse</u>	Situated or extending across something. <i>A transverse beam supports the dashboard.</i>
travel	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>The vessel had been travelling from Libya to Ireland.</i>
<u>traverse</u>	An area of land surveyed with a traverse. <i>They had been practising firing at multiple targets using the power traverse.</i>
trip	Make a trip for pleasure. <i>Somebody tripped the alarm.</i>
