absenteeism	The practice of regularly staying away from work or school without good reason. <i>High levels of absenteeism caused by low job motivation.</i>
across	Used with an expression of measurement. <i>Halfway across Jenny jumped.</i>
beyond	The unknown, especially in references to life after death. <i>The athletes are pushing themselves to their limits and beyond.</i>
consumerism	The theory that an increasing consumption of goods is economically beneficial. <i>The growth of consumerism has led to many organizations improving their service to the customer.</i>
exceed	Go beyond what is allowed or stipulated by (a set limit). <i>Production costs have exceeded 60 000.</i>
excess	Excessive indulgence. <i>As regards other cancers in this age group there is a small excess during 1984 90.</i>
extra	Excessive or extravagant. <i>He is trying to be extra good.</i>
extravagant	Recklessly wasteful. <i>Extravagant praise.</i>
furthermore	In addition. <i>Computer chess games are getting cheaper all the time furthermore their quality is improving.</i>
inordinate	Beyond normal limits. <i>A book of inordinate length.</i>
outdo	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>She outdoes all other athletes.</i>

outrun	Run or travel faster or further than. <i>Their one chance was to outrun their pursuers.</i>
outwit	Beat through cleverness and wit. <i>Ray had outwitted many an opponent.</i>
overstep	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries). <i>You must not overstep your borrowing limit.</i>
<u>overtake</u>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Germany rapidly overtook Britain in industrial output.</i>
pass	An act of passing the hands over something as in conjuring or hypnotism. <i>It is now my duty to pass sentence upon you.</i>
pedantry	Excessive concern with minor details and rules. <i>To object to this is not mere pedantry.</i>
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
superfluity	The state of being superfluous. <i>A superfluity of unoccupied time.</i>
superfluous	Serving no useful purpose; having no excuse for being. <i>Delete superfluous or unnecessary words.</i>
<u>surpass</u>	Do or be better than ever before. <i>Her performance surpasses that of any other student I know.</i>
through	Throughout the entire extent. <i>We need the money to help us get through until he has a new job.</i>
tiredness	The state of wishing for sleep or rest; weariness. <i>Depression and tiredness caused by overwork.</i>
<u>too</u>	In addition; also. <i>He was driving too fast.</i>
transcend	Surpass (a person or achievement). <i>He doubts that he will ever transcend Shakespeare.</i>
<u>transgress</u>	Pass beyond (limits or boundaries). <i>The sea transgresses along the West coast of the island.</i>
<u>undue</u>	Not yet payable. <i>His dress stops just short of undue elegance.</i>
unnecessary	Unnecessary things. <i>Some people feel that holiday insurance is unnecessary.</i>
weariness	Reluctance to see or experience any more of something. <i>He began to feel weariness.</i>
