## Associations of "Go with the flow" (30 Words)

<b>aqueduct</b>	A conduit that resembles a bridge but carries water over a valley.
<b>basin</b>	A bowl for washing typically attached to a wall and having taps connected to a water supply a washbasin. <i>The gravel pit is to be used as a yacht <b>basin</b>.</i>
<b>canal</b>	Provide a city with a canal. <i>They travelled on by <b>canal</b>.</i>
<b>canalize</b>	Provide (a city) with a canal. <i>Successive railway engineers were to divert and <b>canalize</b> many miles of river.</i>
<b>channel</b>	A service or station using a channel of frequencies. <i>Meg Ryan plays Avery as if she s <b>channelling</b> Nicole Kidman.</i>
<b>conduit</b>	A person or organization that acts as a channel for the transmission of something. <i>The gas pipe should not be close to any electrical <b>conduit</b>.</i>
<b>confluence</b>	A coming together of people. <i>The <b>confluence</b> of the Rivers Ouse and Foss.</i>
<b>ditch</b>	Provide with a ditch or ditches. <i>He was picked up by a gunboat after <b>ditching</b> his plane in the Mediterranean.</i>
<b>dive</b>	A cheap disreputable nightclub or dance hall. <i><b>Divers</b> should have a good intake of fluid before each <b>dive</b>.</i>
<b>float</b>	Allow a currency to float. <i>Ice cream <b>floats</b>.</i>
<b>irrigate</b>	Supply with a constant flow or sprinkling of some liquid, for the purpose of cooling, cleansing, or disinfecting. <i><b>Irrigate</b> the wound.</i>

<a href="#">irrigation</a>	(medicine) cleaning a wound or body organ by flushing or washing out with water or a medicated solution. <i>For sinus congestion saline nasal <b>irrigation</b> can be helpful.</i>
<b>isthmus</b>	A narrow organ, passage, or piece of tissue connecting two larger parts.
<b>navigable</b>	(of a website) easy to move around in. <i>A good cart track <b>navigable</b> by cars.</i>
<b>neap</b>	Of a boat be kept aground or in harbour by a neap tide. <i><b>Neaps</b> occur at 6 a m and 6 p m.</i>
<b>overflow</b>	Overflow with a certain feeling. <i>Boxes <b>overflowing</b> with bright flowers.</i>
<b>pipeline</b>	Convey a substance by a pipeline. <i>A <b>pipeline</b> runs from the wells to the seaport.</i>
<a href="#">river</a>	A large natural stream of water flowing in a channel to the sea a lake or another river. <i>Great <b>rivers</b> of molten lava.</i>
<a href="#">sea</a>	Used to refer to waves as opposed to calm sea. <i>There was still some <b>sea</b> running.</i>
<b>sedimentary</b>	Produced by the action of water.
<b>strait</b>	Used in reference to a situation characterized by a specified degree of trouble or difficulty. <i>My captivity was <b>strait</b> as ever.</i>
<a href="#">stream</a>	Something that resembles a flowing stream in moving continuously. <i>His nose <b>streamed</b> blood.</i>
<b>surfing</b>	The sport of riding a surfboard toward the shore on the crest of a wave. <i>Why share your internet connection with people <b>surfing</b> and chatting.</i>
<a href="#">swim</a>	The act of swimming. <i>We had to <b>swim</b> for 20 minutes to reach the shore.</i>
<b>teem</b>	Be teeming be abuzz. <i>The plaza is <b>teeming</b> with undercover policemen.</i>
<b>tidal</b>	Relating to or affected by tides. <i>Strong <b>tidal</b> currents.</i>
<b>tide</b>	Of a ship work in or out of harbour with the help of the tide. <i>He drifted into sleep on a <b>tide</b> of euphoria.</i>
<b>water</b>	Supply with water as with channels or ditches or streams. <i>A <b>water</b> plant.</i>
<b>waterway</b>	A navigable body of water. <i>The canal was a very successful commercial <b>waterway</b>.</i>
