Definitions of "Gods" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “gods” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A man of such superior qualities that he seems like a deity to other people.*
- *Any supernatural being worshipped as controlling some part of the world or some aspect of life or who is the personification of a force.*
- *A material effigy that is worshipped.*
- *The supernatural being conceived as the perfect and omnipotent and omniscient originator and ruler of the universe; the object of worship in monotheistic religions.*



Synonyms of "Gods" as a noun (5 Words)

- deity** A god or goddess (in a polytheistic religion).
*A **deity** of ancient Greece.*
- divinity** The rational and systematic study of religion and its influences and of the nature of religious truth.
*Ancient Egyptians believed in the **divinity** of the Pharaohs.*
- graven image** The set of values of the dependent variable for which a function is defined.
- idol** A person or thing that is greatly admired, loved, or revered.
*A soccer **idol**.*
- immortal** An immortal being especially a god of ancient Greece or Rome.
*He will always be one of the **immortals** of soccer.*



Usage Examples of "Gods" as a noun

- *Money was his god.*
- *He was a god among men.*



Associations of "Gods" (30 Words)

- almighty** A name or title for God.
*I swear by **almighty** God.*
- atheist** A person who disbelieves or lacks belief in the existence of God or gods.
*He is a committed **atheist**.*
- atheistic** Disbelieving or lacking belief in the existence of God.
***Atheistic** scientists.*
- church** Take a woman who has recently given birth to church for a service of thanksgiving.
*The separation of **church** and state.*
- deist** Of or relating to deism.
- deity** Divine status, quality, or nature.
*A ruler driven by delusions of **deity**.*

divine	Resulting from divine providence. <i>Heroes with divine powers.</i>
divinity	A divine being; a god or goddess. <i>Ancient Egyptians believed in the divinity of the Pharaohs.</i>
ecumenism	The doctrine of the ecumenical movement that promotes cooperation and better understanding among different religious denominations: aimed at universal Christian unity.
gentile	A person who is not Jewish. <i>Christians refer to themselves as gentiles.</i>
heathen	Relating to heathens. <i>Heathen practices.</i>
heavenly	Relating to or inhabiting a divine heaven. <i>Heavenly constellations.</i>
heresy	Belief or opinion contrary to orthodox religious (especially Christian) doctrine. <i>The heresy of being uncommitted to the right political dogma.</i>
heretic	A person who holds religious beliefs in conflict with the dogma of the Roman Catholic Church.
heretical	Characterized by departure from accepted beliefs or standards. <i>A heretical theologian.</i>
heterodox	Characterized by departure from accepted beliefs or standards. <i>Heterodox views.</i>
holy	Belonging to or derived from or associated with a divine power. <i>Saints and holy men.</i>
idol	A person or thing that is greatly admired, loved, or revered. <i>A soccer idol.</i>
infidel	A person who does not acknowledge your god. <i>The infidel foe.</i>
irreligious	Indifferent or hostile to religion, or having no religious beliefs. <i>An irreligious man.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>The Church of England liturgy.</i>
monotheism	Belief in a single God.
orison	Reverent petition to a deity.
pagan	Relating to pagans or their beliefs. <i>A Muslim majority had to live in close proximity to large communities of Christians and pagans.</i>

pantheon	A group of particularly respected, famous, or important people. <i>The deities of the Hindu pantheon.</i>
pray	Address a deity a prophet a saint or an object of worship say a prayer. <i>Ladies and gentlemen pray be seated.</i>
religion	An institution to express belief in a divine power. <i>Consumerism is the new religion.</i>
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>Religious houses were built on ancient pagan sites.</i>
theism	The doctrine or belief in the existence of a God or gods. <i>There are many different forms of theism.</i>
worship	The activity of worshipping. <i>They worship in the traditional manner.</i>
