Associations of "Goes" (30 Words)

across	Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally. <i>He had swum across.</i>
antipodal	Relating to or denoting cells formed at the chalazal end of the embryo sac. <i>Antipodal points on a sphere.</i>
astray	Away from the right path or direction. <i>A bullet went astray and killed a bystander.</i>
athwart	At an oblique angle. <i>Our words ran athwart and we ended up at cross purposes.</i>
bereavement	State of sorrow over the death or departure of a loved one. <i>The family suffered a sad bereavement.</i>
beyond	The unknown, especially in references to life after death. <i>A view of Hobart with Mount Wellington beyond.</i>
christendom	The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).
continuing	Remaining in force or being carried on without letup. <i>The continuing struggle to put food on the table.</i>
cross	Cause to intersect or lie crosswise. <i>No one dared cross him.</i>
crossover	A path (often marked) where something (as a street or railroad) can be crossed to get from one side to the other. <i>A jazz classical crossover album.</i>
decamp	Leave suddenly. <i>She persuaded him to decamp.</i>
depart	Be at variance with; be out of line with. <i>They departed for Germany.</i>

going	Advancing toward a goal. <i>The paths were covered with drifting snow and the going was difficult.</i>
horizon	A great circle of the celestial sphere the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place. <i>It is beyond the horizon of present knowledge.</i>
intercontinental	Relating to or travelling between continents. <i>Intercontinental ballistic missiles.</i>
intersect	(of two or more things) pass or lie across each other. <i>The area is intersected only by minor roads.</i>
intertwine	Twist or twine together. <i>Intertwined hearts.</i>
itinerate	(especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty. <i>Regular use of itinerating magistrates was made.</i>
migrate	(of a person) move to a new area or country in order to find work or better living conditions. <i>As autumn arrives the birds migrate south.</i>
migration	A group of people migrating together (especially in some given time period). <i>There is virtually no cell migration in plants.</i>
move	Have a turn make one's move in a game. <i>His move put him directly in my path.</i>
pedestrian	A person who travels by foot. <i>The road is so dangerous pedestrians avoid it.</i>
road	A railroad. <i>He had to work in a road about six feet wide.</i>
rood	A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.
route	Send via a specific route. <i>Proposals have been put forward for a new route around the south of the town.</i>
transverse	Situated or extending across something. <i>Transverse colon.</i>
travel	A period of time spent travelling from one place to another typically over long distances. <i>Light travels faster than sound.</i>

traverse

An area of land surveyed with a traverse.
*They had been practising firing at multiple targets using the power **traverse**.*

trip

Make a trip for pleasure.
*You re **tripping** if you think I m hanging around.*

underway

Currently in progress.
*Preparations for the trial are **underway**.*
