| <a href="#">across</a>    | Referring to a crossword answer which reads horizontally.<br><i>He had swum <b>across</b>.</i>   |
| <b>antipodal</b>          | Relating to or denoting cells formed at the chalazal end of the embryo sac.<br><i><b>Antipodal</b> points on a sphere.</i>   |
| <a href="#">astray</a>    | Away from the right path or direction.<br><i>A bullet went <b>astray</b> and killed a bystander.</i>   |
| <b>athwart</b>            | At an oblique angle.<br><i>Our words ran <b>athwart</b> and we ended up at cross purposes.</i>   |
| <b>bereavement</b>        | State of sorrow over the death or departure of a loved one.<br><i>The family suffered a sad <b>bereavement</b>.</i>  |
| <a href="#">beyond</a>    | The unknown, especially in references to life after death.<br><i>A view of Hobart with Mount Wellington <b>beyond</b>.</i>   |
| <b>christendom</b>        | The collective body of Christians throughout the world and history (found predominantly in Europe and the Americas and Australia).                                   |
| <b>continuing</b>         | Remaining in force or being carried on without letup.<br><i>The <b>continuing</b> struggle to put food on the table.</i>   |
| <a href="#">cross</a>     | Cause to intersect or lie crosswise.<br><i>No one dared <b>cross</b> him.</i>  |
| <a href="#">crossover</a> | A path (often marked) where something (as a street or railroad) can be crossed to get from one side to the other.<br><i>A jazz classical <b>crossover</b> album.</i> |
| <b>decamp</b>             | Leave suddenly.<br><i>She persuaded him to <b>decamp</b>.</i>  |
| <a href="#">depart</a>    | Be at variance with; be out of line with.<br><i>They <b>departed</b> for Germany.</i>  |

| <b>going</b>            | Advancing toward a goal.<br><i>The paths were covered with drifting snow and the <b>going</b> was difficult.</i>   |
| <b>horizon</b>          | A great circle of the celestial sphere the plane of which passes through the centre of the earth and is parallel to that of the apparent horizon of a place.<br><i>It is beyond the <b>horizon</b> of present knowledge.</i> |
| <b>intercontinental</b> | Relating to or travelling between continents.<br><i><b>Intercontinental</b> ballistic missiles.</i>  |
| <b>intersect</b>        | (of two or more things) pass or lie across each other.<br><i>The area is <b>intersected</b> only by minor roads.</i>   |
| <b>intertwine</b>       | Twist or twine together.<br><i><b>Intertwined</b> hearts.</i>  |
| <b>itinerate</b>        | (especially of a Church minister or a magistrate) travel from place to place to perform one's professional duty.<br><i>Regular use of <b>itinerating</b> magistrates was made.</i>   |
| <b>migrate</b>          | (of a person) move to a new area or country in order to find work or better living conditions.<br><i>As autumn arrives the birds <b>migrate</b> south.</i>   |
| <b>migration</b>        | A group of people migrating together (especially in some given time period).<br><i>There is virtually no cell <b>migration</b> in plants.</i>  |
| <b>move</b>             | Have a turn make one's move in a game.<br><i>His <b>move</b> put him directly in my path.</i>  |
| <b>pedestrian</b>       | A person who travels by foot.<br><i>The road is so dangerous <b>pedestrians</b> avoid it.</i>  |
| <b>road</b>             | A railroad.<br><i>He had to work in a <b>road</b> about six feet wide.</i>   |
| <b>rood</b>             | A crucifix especially one positioned above the rood screen of a church or on a beam over the entrance to the chancel.  |
| <b>route</b>            | Send via a specific route.<br><i>Proposals have been put forward for a new <b>route</b> around the south of the town.</i>  |
| <b>transverse</b>       | Situated or extending across something.<br><i><b>Transverse</b> colon.</i>   |
| <b>travel</b>           | A period of time spent travelling from one place to another typically over long distances.<br><i>Light <b>travels</b> faster than sound.</i>   |

*They had been practising firing at multiple targets using the power **traverse**.*

**trip**

Make a trip for pleasure.  
*You re **tripping** if you think I m hanging around.*

**underway**

Currently in progress.  
*Preparations for the trial are **underway**.*
