
### **Goofy as an Adjective**

- Having or displaying protruding or crooked front teeth.
- Ludicrous, foolish.
- (in surfing and other board sports) having the right leg in front of the left on the board.
- Foolish or harmlessly eccentric.







## Synonyms of "Goofy" as an adjective (31 Words)

absurd	Inconsistent with reason or logic or common sense- Walter Lippman. It may look <b>absurd</b> but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.
bizarre	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. A <b>bizarre</b> situation.
cranky	(of a machine) working erratically. He was <b>cranky</b> after eight hours of working.
crazy	Extremely enthusiastic. The crowd went <b>crazy</b> .
<u>eccentric</u>	(of a person or their behaviour) unconventional and slightly strange. Famed for his <b>eccentric</b> spelling.
fantastic	Existing in fancy only- Nathaniel Hawthorne. A <b>fantastic</b> trip to the Orient.
far out	Being of a considerable distance or length.
freakish	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. A <b>freakish</b> combination of styles.
<u>idiosyncratic</u>	Peculiar to the individual. She emerged as one of the great <b>idiosyncratic</b> talents of the nineties.
<u>insane</u>	Very foolish. They were making <b>insane</b> amounts of money.
jutting	Extending out above or beyond a surface or boundary. <i>The <b>jutting</b> limb of a tree.</i>
madcap	Characterized by undue haste and lack of thought or deliberation. A <b>madcap</b> scheme.
nonsensical	Having no meaning; making no sense. Ask a <b>nonsensical</b> question and get a <b>nonsensical</b> answer.
obtrusive	Undesirably noticeable. Equally <b>obtrusive</b> was the graffiti.
<u>odd</u>	An indefinite quantity more than that specified. It s <b>odd</b> that she didn t recognize me.
offbeat	Unconventional; unusual. The answer sums up his <b>offbeat</b> skewed vision of the world.
outlandish	Looking or sounding bizarre or unfamiliar. <i>Outlandish</i> brightly coloured clothes.



peculiar	Markedly different from the usual-Virginia Woolf. An expression <b>peculiar</b> to Canadians.
prominent	Conspicuous in position or importance. A <b>prominent</b> citizen.
protuberant	Curving outward. His <b>protuberant</b> eyes fluttered open.
proud	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <b>Proud</b> parents.
<u>quirky</u>	Having or characterized by peculiar or unexpected traits or aspects. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly <b>quirky</b>.</i>
ridiculous	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children was <b>ridiculous</b>.</i>
silly	Ridiculously trivial or frivolous. <i>Silly giggles.</i>
standing out	Having a supporting base.
strange	Relating to or originating in or characteristic of another place or part of the world. <i>Children have some strange ideas.</i>
<u>surreal</u>	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. A <b>surreal</b> mix of fact and fantasy.
wacky	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. A <b>wacky</b> chase movie.
<u>weird</u>	Strikingly odd or unusual. <i>Weird</i> inhuman sounds.
whacky	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
zany	Amusingly unconventional and idiosyncratic. <i>His <b>zany</b> humour.</i>

# Associations of "Goofy" (30 Words)

absurd	An absurd state of affairs. It may look <b>absurd</b> but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.
absurdity	The quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable. The crowd laughed at the <b>absurdity</b> of the clown s behavior.
comical	Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way. A <b>comical</b> look of surprise.
<u>daft</u>	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. Don t ask such <b>daft</b> questions.
dullard	A person who evokes boredom. <i>He was caricatured as a dupe and a <b>dullard</b>.</i>



farcical	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>He considered the whole idea</i> <b>farcical</b> .
fatuity	A ludicrous folly.
fatuous	Extremely silly or stupid. A <b>fatuous</b> comment.
folly	Foolish or senseless behavior. Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of <b>folly</b> .
fool	Fool or hoax. He <b>fool</b> ed nightclub managers into believing he was a successful businessman.
foolish	Having or revealing stupidity. <i>Foolish remarks</i> .
<u>idiotic</u>	Having a mental age of three to seven years. I was able to hum its <b>idiotic</b> theme tune.
illogical	Lacking in correct logical relation. An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.
impolitic	Not politic. An <b>impolitic</b> approach to a sensitive issue.
inadvisable	Not prudent or wise; not recommended. An unnecessary and <b>inadvisable</b> action.
inane	Extremely silly or stupid. Don t badger people with <b>inane</b> questions.
injudicious	Lacking or showing lack of judgment or discretion; unwise. I took a few <b>injudicious</b> swigs of potent cider.
<u>laughable</u>	Incongruous;inviting ridicule. If it didn t make me so angry it would be <b>laughable</b> .
<u>ludicrous</u>	Incongruous;inviting ridicule. It s <b>ludicrous</b> that I have been fined.
<u>nonsense</u>	Ornamental objects of no great value. <i>Nonsense</i> syllables.
nuts	Mad. The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me <b>nuts</b> .
preposterous	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. A <b>preposterous</b> attempt to turn back the pages of history.
puerile	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. A <b>puerile</b> argument.



ridiculous	Inspiring scornful pity. It seems absolutely <b>ridiculous</b> that anyone would try to pull a stunt like this.
ridiculously	So as to arouse or deserve laughter. <b>Ridiculously</b> I felt like crying.
silly	Helpless; defenceless (typically used of a woman, child, or animal). <i>He would brood about <b>silly</b> things.</i>
<u>twit</u>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping.
<u>unwise</u>	Showing or resulting from lack of judgment or wisdom. An <b>unwise</b> investor is soon impoverished.
vacuous	Having or showing a lack of thought or intelligence; mindless. <i>Vacuous comments.</i>
zany	A zany person. A <b>zany</b> sense of humor.
