Synonyms of "Goofy" as an adjective (31 Words)

absurd	Inconsistent with reason or logic or common sense- Walter Lippman. <i>It may look absurd but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.</i>
bizarre	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>A bizarre situation.</i>
cranky	(of a machine) working erratically. <i>He was cranky after eight hours of working.</i>
crazy	Extremely enthusiastic. <i>The crowd went crazy.</i>
<u>eccentric</u>	(of a person or their behaviour) unconventional and slightly strange. <i>Famed for his eccentric spelling.</i>
fantastic	Existing in fancy only- Nathaniel Hawthorne. <i>A fantastic trip to the Orient.</i>
far out	Being of a considerable distance or length.
freakish	Conspicuously or grossly unconventional or unusual. <i>A freakish combination of styles.</i>
<u>idiosyncratic</u>	Peculiar to the individual. <i>She emerged as one of the great idiosyncratic talents of the nineties.</i>
<u>insane</u>	Very foolish. <i>They were making insane amounts of money.</i>
jutting	Extending out above or beyond a surface or boundary. <i>The jutting limb of a tree.</i>
madcap	Characterized by undue haste and lack of thought or deliberation. <i>A madcap scheme.</i>
nonsensical	Having no meaning; making no sense. <i>Ask a nonsensical question and get a nonsensical answer.</i>
obtrusive	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Equally obtrusive was the graffiti.</i>
<u>odd</u>	An indefinite quantity more than that specified. <i>It s odd that she didn t recognize me.</i>
offbeat	Unconventional; unusual. <i>The answer sums up his offbeat skewed vision of the world.</i>
outlandish	Looking or sounding bizarre or unfamiliar. <i>Outlandish brightly coloured clothes.</i>

peculiar	Markedly different from the usual-Virginia Woolf. <i>An expression peculiar to Canadians.</i>
prominent	Conspicuous in position or importance. <i>A prominent citizen.</i>
protuberant	Curving outward. <i>His protuberant eyes fluttered open.</i>
proud	Of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud. <i>Proud parents.</i>
quirky	Having or characterized by peculiar or unexpected traits or aspects. <i>Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky.</i>
ridiculous	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children was ridiculous.</i>
silly	Ridiculously trivial or frivolous. <i>Silly giggles.</i>
standing out	Having a supporting base.
strange	Relating to or originating in or characteristic of another place or part of the world. <i>Children have some strange ideas.</i>
surreal	Having the qualities of surrealism bizarre. <i>A surreal mix of fact and fantasy.</i>
wacky	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>A wacky chase movie.</i>
weird	Strikingly odd or unusual. <i>Weird inhuman sounds.</i>
whacky	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
zany	Amusingly unconventional and idiosyncratic. <i>His zany humour.</i>

- absurd** An absurd state of affairs.
*It may look **absurd** but having a treadmill desk could improve your attention span.*
- absurdity** The quality or state of being ridiculous or wildly unreasonable.
*The crowd laughed at the **absurdity** of the clown's behavior.*
- comical** Amusing, especially in a ludicrous or absurd way.
*A **comical** look of surprise.*
- daft** Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.
*Don't ask such **daft** questions.*
- dullard** A person who evokes boredom.
*He was caricatured as a dupe and a **dullard**.*

farcical	Relating to or resembling farce, especially because of absurd or ridiculous aspects. <i>He considered the whole idea farcical.</i>
fatuity	A ludicrous folly.
fatuous	Extremely silly or stupid. <i>A fatuous comment.</i>
folly	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of folly.</i>
fool	Fool or hoax. <i>He fooled nightclub managers into believing he was a successful businessman.</i>
foolish	Having or revealing stupidity. <i>Foolish remarks.</i>
idiotic	Having a mental age of three to seven years. <i>I was able to hum its idiotic theme tune.</i>
illogical	Lacking in correct logical relation. <i>An illogical fear of the supernatural.</i>
impolitic	Not politic. <i>An impolitic approach to a sensitive issue.</i>
inadvisable	Not prudent or wise; not recommended. <i>An unnecessary and inadvisable action.</i>
inane	Extremely silly or stupid. <i>Don't badger people with inane questions.</i>
injudicious	Lacking or showing lack of judgment or discretion; unwise. <i>I took a few injudicious swigs of potent cider.</i>
laughable	Incongruous; inviting ridicule. <i>If it didn't make me so angry it would be laughable.</i>
ludicrous	Incongruous; inviting ridicule. <i>It's ludicrous that I have been fined.</i>
nonsense	Ornamental objects of no great value. <i>Nonsense syllables.</i>
nuts	Mad. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me nuts.</i>
preposterous	Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous. <i>A preposterous attempt to turn back the pages of history.</i>
puerile	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. <i>A puerile argument.</i>

ridiculous	Inspiring scornful pity. <i>It seems absolutely ridiculous that anyone would try to pull a stunt like this.</i>
ridiculously	So as to arouse or deserve laughter. <i>Ridiculously I felt like crying.</i>
silly	Helpless; defenceless (typically used of a woman, child, or animal). <i>He would brood about silly things.</i>
twit	Harass with persistent criticism or carping.
unwise	Showing or resulting from lack of judgment or wisdom. <i>An unwise investor is soon impoverished.</i>
vacuous	Having or showing a lack of thought or intelligence; mindless. <i>Vacuous comments.</i>
zany	A zany person. <i>A zany sense of humor.</i>
