
Goofy as an Adjective

Peculiar to the individual.

idiosyncratic She emerged as one of the great idiosyncratic talents of the nineties.

Very foolish. <u>insane</u>

They were making **insane** amounts of money.

Extending out above or beyond a surface or boundary.

jutting The **jutting** limb of a tree.

Characterized by undue haste and lack of thought or deliberation. madcap

A madcap scheme.

Having no meaning; making no sense. nonsensical

Ask a **nonsensical** question and get a **nonsensical** answer.

Undesirably noticeable. obtrusive

Equally **obtrusive** was the graffiti.

An indefinite quantity more than that specified. odd

It s **odd** that she didn t recognize me.

Unconventional: unusual. offbeat

The answer sums up his **offbeat** skewed vision of the world.

Looking or sounding bizarre or unfamiliar. outlandish

Outlandish brightly coloured clothes.

prominent Conspicuous in position or importance.

A **prominent** citizen.

protuberant Curving outward.

His **protuberant** eyes fluttered open.

of an event achievement etc causing someone to feel proud.

Proud parents.

Having or characterized by peculiar or unexpected traits or aspects.

Her sense of humour was decidedly quirky.

So unreasonable as to invite derision.

ridiculous Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children

standing out Having a supporting base.

Don t badger people with **inane** questions.

injudicious Lacking or showing lack of judgment or discretion; unwise.

Incongruous; inviting ridicule.

laughable If it didn t make me so angry it would be laughable.

Ornamental objects of no great value.

nonsense Nonsense syllables.

Mad.

The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me **nuts**.

Contrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous.

preposterous

A **preposterous** attempt to turn back the pages of history.

Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity.

puerileA puerile argument.



Inspiring scornful pity.
