

butcherly Accompanied by bloodshed.

Causing horror or disgust. grisly

A grisly murder.

Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. **gruesome** 

The most **gruesome** murder.

Accompanied by bloodshed.

sanguinary This bitter and **sanguinary** war.



sanguineous Resembling or containing blood.

(of a person or group) primitive and uncivilized.

savage A savage attack on the government.

slaughterous Accompanied by bloodshed.

Marked by extreme intensity of emotions or convictions inclined to react

**violent** violently fervid.

A violent clash of colors.

**Awful** bloody images.

**barbarism** philological rules, e.g. a word formed from elements of different languages, such as breathalyser (English and Greek) or television (Greek and Latin).

The collapse of civilization and the return to **barbarism**.

barbarous Primitive and uncivilized.

Avoiding **barbarous** sentences or ambiguities.

**beastly** In a beastly manner. Don t be **beastly** to him.



bloodthirsty Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed.

**Bloodthirsty** yells.

**brutal** Disagreeably direct and precise.

**Brutal** beatings.

**brutish** Resembling a beast; showing lack of human sensibility.

A dull and **brutish** man.

The killing of a large number of people.

The bombing was timed to cause as much **carnage** as possible.

cruel (of persons or their actions) able or disposed to inflict pain or suffering.

Ernie nearly **cruel**led the whole thing by laughing.

**devilry** Wicked activity.

Some spirit of **devilry** made me go on teasing her.

(of a person) unwell or troubled.

dreadful Dreadful manners.

**ferocious** Very great; extreme. *A ferocious* beating.

The property of being wild or turbulent.

The **ferocity** of the storm caught them by surprise.

**fiendish** Extremely cruel or unpleasant.

A **fiendish** problem.

heinous (of a person or wrongful act, especially a crime) utterly odious or wicked.

A battery of **heinous** crimes.

**hellish** Of or like hell.

It had been a **hellish** week.

**horror** Something that inspires horror something horrible. *Photographs showed the* **horror** of the tragedy.

inhuman Belonging to or resembling something nonhuman.

A babel of **inhuman** noises.

inhumane Lacking and reflecting lack of pity or compassion.

Biological weapons are considered too **inhumane** to be used.

inhumanity Extremely cruel and brutal behaviour.

Man s **inhumanity** to man.

**insensate** Devoid of feeling and consciousness and animation.

**Insensate** jabbering.

**odious** Extremely unpleasant; repulsive.

Consequences **odious** to those you govern.



pitiless Showing no pity; cruel.

A night of **pitiless** rain.

repression A state of forcible subjugation.

The **repression** of anger can be positively harmful.

sanguinary

Marked by eagerness to resort to violence and bloodshed-G.W.Johnson.

This bitter and **sanguinary** war.

savage Criticize harshly or violently.

A **savage** race.

terrible Intensely or extremely bad or unpleasant in degree or quality.

**Terrible** handwriting. Excellent; wonderful.

wicked He pulled the long wicked looking dagger from its sheath.
