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## Associations of "Got" (30 Words)

<b>acquire</b>	Come into the possession of something concrete or abstract. <i>I <b>acquired</b> a strong aversion to television.</i>
<b>acquired</b>	Gotten through environmental forces. <i><b>Acquired</b> characteristics such as a suntan or a broken nose cannot be passed on.</i>
<b>achievement</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>achievement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	An asset or object bought or obtained, typically by a library or museum. <i>The child s <b>acquisition</b> of language.</i>
<b>arrive</b>	Reach a destination arrive by movement or progress. <i>The invitation <b>arrived</b> a few days later.</i>
<a href="#">attain</a>	Reach (a specified age, size, or amount). <i>He <b>attained</b> the rank of Brigadier.</i>
<a href="#">attainable</a>	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Choose an <b>attainable</b> goal.</i>
<b>available</b>	Convenient for use or disposal. <i>The list of <b>available</b> candidates is unusually long.</i>
<b>bring</b>	Go or come after and bring or take back. <i><b>Bring</b> comments.</i>
<b>come</b>	Come forth. <i>He s <b>come</b> a long way.</i>
<b>derive</b>	Arise from or originate in (a specified source). <i>The present name <b>derives</b> from an older form.</i>
<a href="#">earn</a>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>I <b>earned</b> 10 an hour working in the shop.</i>
<b>expulsion</b>	Squeezing out by applying pressure. <i>His <b>expulsion</b> from the union.</i>

<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>She <b>fetch</b>ed me a cup of tea.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Increase the amount or rate of (something, typically weight or speed). <i>She <b>gain</b>ed 20 pounds when she stopped exercising.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with archaic use. <i>I <b>have</b> two years left.</i>
<u><b>incur</b></u>	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>People who smoke <b>incur</b> a great danger to their health.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Get, acquire, or secure (something). <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to <b>obtain</b>.</i>
<b>obtainable</b>	Able to be obtained. <i>Customers financial details are easily <b>obtainable</b>.</i>
<b>possession</b>	The state of being controlled by a demon or spirit. <i>He remains in full <b>possession</b> of his sanity.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Arrange for sexual partners for others. <i>He <b>procured</b> his wife to sign the mandate for the joint account.</i>
<u><b>procurement</b></u>	The act of getting possession of something. <i>Financial assistance for the <b>procurement</b> of legal advice.</i>
<b>purchase</b>	Obtain by purchase acquire by means of a financial transaction. <i>The large number of videos currently available for <b>purchase</b>.</i>
<b>reach</b>	A distance traversed in reaching. <i>Denim shorts that <b>reach</b> to his knees.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>Representatives of the club will be <b>received</b> by the Mayor.</i>
<b>recipient</b>	The semantic role of the animate entity that is passively involved in the happening denoted by the verb in the clause. <i>The <b>recipient</b> of the Nobel Peace Prize.</i>
<u><b>regain</b></u>	Come upon after searching; find the location of something that was missed or lost. <i>They were unable to <b>regain</b> their boats.</i>
<b>retrieval</b>	The action of obtaining or consulting material stored in a computer system. <i>The investigation was completed after the <b>retrieval</b> of plane wreckage.</i>
<u><b>secure</b></u>	Seek to guarantee repayment of (a loan) by having a right to take possession of an asset in the event of non-payment. <i>A <b>secure</b> investment.</i>

Manage to obtain (something) by persuading or cleverly manipulating someone.
