## Associations of "Grabbed" (30 Words)

<a href="#">belong</a>	Be suitable or acceptable. <i>You and me we <b>belong</b> together.</i>
<b>broach</b>	Bring up a topic for discussion. <i>Boxed wines will remain in good condition for up to four months once <b>broached</b>.</i>
<b>capture</b>	A person or thing that has been captured. <i>Black cannot <b>capture</b> the knight.</i>
<b>catch</b>	Be the catcher. <i>We ll get some burgers and <b>catch</b> a movie.</i>
<b>clasp</b>	Grasp (something) tightly with one’s hand. <i>He <b>clasped</b> her arm.</i>
<a href="#">clench</a>	A contraction or tightening of part of the body. <i><b>Clench</b> a steering wheel.</i>
<b>clinch</b>	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i><b>Clinch</b> a deal.</i>
<b>clutch</b>	A clutch bag. <i>A <b>clutch</b> quarterback.</i>
<a href="#">engage</a>	Keep engaged. <i>She had offered to <b>engage</b> a room in the house of the woman.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will <b>fetch</b> you.</i>
<b>grapple</b>	A tool consisting of several hooks for grasping and holding; often thrown with a rope. <i>Passers by <b>grappled</b> with the man after the knife attack.</i>
<a href="#">grasp</a>	The act of grasping. <i>The child slipped from her <b>grasp</b>.</i>

<b>grip</b>	A hairgrip. <i>He had to take a <b>grip</b> on his nerves.</i>
<b>have</b>	Have sex with archaic use. <i><b>Have</b> a postdoc.</i>
<b><u>hijack</u></b>	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>An unsuccessful <b>hijack</b> attempt.</i>
<b>hijacker</b>	A person who takes over an organization or activity and uses it for a different purpose. <i>A <b>hijacker</b> of arms shipments.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>A crazy idea took <b>hold</b> of him.</i>
<b>impound</b>	Shut up (domestic animals) in a pound or enclosure. <i>It will <b>impound</b> a reservoir 130 miles long.</i>
<b><u>kidnap</u></b>	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>The industrialist's son was <b>kidnapped</b>.</i>
<b>kidnapping</b>	The action of abducting someone and holding them captive. <i>A new wave of <b>kidnappings</b> and murders.</i>
<b>obtain</b>	Get, acquire, or secure (something). <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to <b>obtain</b>.</i>
<b><u>own</u></b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father <b>owns</b> a restaurant.</i>
<b><u>possess</u></b>	Have possession of as distinct from ownership. <i>A terrible rage <b>possessed</b> her.</i>
<b>seize</b>	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The terrorists <b>seized</b> the politicians.</i>
<b>take</b>	Occupy or take on. <i>She <b>takes</b> Route 1 to Newark.</i>
<b>tongs</b>	Any of various devices for taking hold of objects; usually have two hinged legs with handles above and pointed hooks below. <i>Sugar <b>tongs</b>.</i>
<b>transfix</b>	Pierce with a sharp stake or point. <i>A field mouse is <b>transfixed</b> by the curved talons of an owl.</i>
<b>understandable</b>	Able to be understood. <i>Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly <b>understandable</b>.</i>

A holding device attached to a workbench; has two jaws to hold workpiece firmly in place.
