Associations of "Grabbed" (30 Words)

belong	Be suitable or acceptable. <i>You and me we belong together.</i>
broach	Bring up a topic for discussion. <i>Boxed wines will remain in good condition for up to four months once broached.</i>
capture	A person or thing that has been captured. <i>Black cannot capture the knight.</i>
catch	Be the catcher. <i>We ll get some burgers and catch a movie.</i>
clasp	Grasp (something) tightly with one’s hand. <i>He clasped her arm.</i>
clench	A contraction or tightening of part of the body. <i>Clench a steering wheel.</i>
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>Clinch a deal.</i>
clutch	A clutch bag. <i>A clutch quarterback.</i>
engage	Keep engaged. <i>She had offered to engage a room in the house of the woman.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will fetch you.</i>
grapple	A tool consisting of several hooks for grasping and holding; often thrown with a rope. <i>Passers by grappled with the man after the knife attack.</i>
grasp	The act of grasping. <i>The child slipped from her grasp.</i>

grip	A hairgrip. <i>He had to take a grip on his nerves.</i>
have	Have sex with archaic use. <i>Have a postdoc.</i>
<u>hijack</u>	An incident or act of hijacking. <i>An unsuccessful hijack attempt.</i>
hijacker	A person who takes over an organization or activity and uses it for a different purpose. <i>A hijacker of arms shipments.</i>
hold	Be capable of holding or containing. <i>A crazy idea took hold of him.</i>
impound	Shut up (domestic animals) in a pound or enclosure. <i>It will impound a reservoir 130 miles long.</i>
<u>kidnap</u>	The action of kidnapping someone. <i>The industrialist's son was kidnapped.</i>
kidnapping	The action of abducting someone and holding them captive. <i>A new wave of kidnappings and murders.</i>
obtain	Get, acquire, or secure (something). <i>Adequate insurance cover is difficult to obtain.</i>
<u>own</u>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
<u>possess</u>	Have possession of as distinct from ownership. <i>A terrible rage possessed her.</i>
seize	Seize and take control without authority and possibly with force take as one's right or possession. <i>The terrorists seized the politicians.</i>
take	Occupy or take on. <i>She takes Route 1 to Newark.</i>
tongs	Any of various devices for taking hold of objects; usually have two hinged legs with handles above and pointed hooks below. <i>Sugar tongs.</i>
transfix	Pierce with a sharp stake or point. <i>A field mouse is transfixed by the curved talons of an owl.</i>
understandable	Able to be understood. <i>Though his accent was strange the words were perfectly understandable.</i>

A holding device attached to a workbench; has two jaws to hold workpiece firmly in place.
