- *A collection of points whose coordinates satisfy a given relation.*
- *A written symbol that is used to represent speech.*

cartography

The science or practice of drawing maps.

chart

Plot a course on a chart.

chiaroscuro	An effect of contrasted light and shadow. <i>The chiaroscuro of cobbled streets.</i>
crayon	Draw with a crayon or crayons. <i>A red crayon.</i>
denouement	The final part of a play, film, or narrative in which the strands of the plot are drawn together and matters are explained or resolved. <i>The film s denouement was unsatisfying and ambiguous.</i>
<u>diagram</u>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. <i>A diagram of the living room.</i>
draft	Select a player for a sports team through the draft. <i>Draft a speech.</i>
draftsmanship	The creation of artistic pictures or diagrams.
<u>drawing</u>	The act of moving a load by drawing or pulling. <i>Entrants need not be present at the drawing.</i>
exploded	(of a diagram) showing the components of a mechanism in the normal relative positions but slightly separated from each other. <i>The manufacturer provided an exploded view of the apparatus.</i>
flowchart	A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system.
formulaic	Produced in accordance with a mechanically followed rule or style. <i>Formulaic expressions such as <i>Once upon a time</i>.</i>
graffiti	Write words or drawings as graffiti. <i>The station was covered in graffiti.</i>
<u>graphic</u>	Of or relating to the graphic arts British Book News. <i>Graphic accounts of battle.</i>
machination	A plot or scheme.
<u>maneuver</u>	Perform a movement in military or naval tactics in order to secure an advantage in attack or defense. <i>He maneuvered to get the chairmanship.</i>
map	Represent an area on a map make a map of. <i>This data is then mapped against a policy model.</i>
<u>painting</u>	The action or skill of using paint, either in a picture or as decoration. <i>You can finish the job of painting faster with a roller than with a brush.</i>
plan	Design or make a plan of something to be made or built. <i>The rebels had planned turmoil and confusion.</i>
plat	Make a plat of. <i>He bought back the site platted it and named it after his realtor.</i>

plot

A chart or map showing the movements or progress of an object.
*They **plotted** the overthrow of the government.*

project

Make a projection of the earth sky etc on a plane surface.
*A history **project**.*

representation

A factual statement made by one party in order to induce another party to enter into a contract.
*A Congressional vacancy occurred in the **representation** from California.*

schematic

In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit.
*This concept is shown in **schematic** form in Figure 1.*

summary

A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form.
*He gave a **summary** of the conclusions.*

synopsis

A brief summary or general survey of something.
*A **synopsis** of the insurance cover provided is set out below.*
