- A visual representation of the relations between certain quantities plotted with reference to a set of axes.
- A visual representation of the relations between certain quantities, represented as points, plotted with reference to a set of axes.
- A collection of points whose coordinates satisfy a given relation.
- A written symbol that is used to represent speech.

A grid of regular squares on a map that are marked with numbers or letters to enable a place to be precisely located. *The metal grids had been pulled across the foyer.*





<u>bar</u>	Secure with or as if with bars. The opening bar s of the first hymn.
<u>blueprint</u>	Make a blueprint of. The scheme was a blueprint for future development programmes.
cartography	The science or practice of drawing maps.

draftsmanship	The creation of artistic pictures or diagrams.
<u>drawing</u>	The act of moving a load by drawing or pulling. Entrants need not be present at the drawing .
exploded	(of a diagram) showing the components of a mechanism in the normal relative positions but slightly separated from each other. The manufacturer provided an exploded view of the apparatus.
flowchart	A diagram of the sequence of operations in a computer program or an accounting system.
formulaic	Produced in accordance with a mechanically followed rule or style. <i>Formulaic</i> expressions such as Once upon a time.
graffiti	Write words or drawings as graffiti. The station was covered in graffiti .
<u>graphic</u>	Of or relating to the graphic arts British Book News. <i>Graphic</i> accounts of battle.
machination	A plot or scheme.
<u>maneuver</u>	Perform a movement in military or naval tactics in order to secure an advantage in attack or defense. <i>He maneuver</i> ed to get the chairmanship.
тар	Represent an area on a map make a map of. This data is then map ped against a policy model.
painting	The action or skill of using paint, either in a picture or as decoration. You can finish the job of painting faster with a roller than with a brush.
plan	Design or make a plan of something to be made or built. The rebels had plan ned turmoil and confusion.

<u>schematic</u>	In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit. This concept is shown in schematic form in Figure 1.
summary	A brief statement that presents the main points in a concise form. <i>He gave a summary of the conclusions.</i>
<u>synopsis</u>	A brief summary or general survey of something.
