delineative	Depicted in a recognizable manner.
depictive	Depicted in a recognizable manner.
detailed	Having many details or facts; showing attention to detail. <i>More detailed information was needed.</i>
diagrammatic	Shown or represented by diagrams. <i>A diagrammatic representation of the system.</i>
drawn	(of a person) looking strained from illness, exhaustion, anxiety, or pain. <i>Her face was drawn and haggard from sleeplessness.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Let me be explicit.</i>
<u>expressive</u>	Conveying (a specified quality or idea). <i>She has big expressive eyes.</i>

forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>She was a forceful personality.</i>

<u>illustrative</u>	Clarifying by use of examples. <i>This timetable is provided for illustrative purposes only.</i>
in writing	Currently fashionable.
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>The artist had etched a lifelike horse.</i>
pictorial	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>Pictorial poetry and prose.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>A powerful bomb.</i>
punchy	Having an immediate impact; forceful. <i>His style is journalistic with short punchy sentences.</i>
<u>striking</u>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. <i>It is striking that no research into the problem is being carried out.</i>
<u>symbolic</u>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. <i>A repeating design symbolic of eternity.</i>
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>A naturally uninhibited sexuality.</i>
<u>visual</u>	Visible- Shakespeare. <i>Visual perception.</i>
<u>vivid</u>	Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. <i>The rhododendron bush provides a vivid splash of mauve.</i>
<u>written</u>	Written as for a film or play or broadcast. <i>Written laws.</i>

*The ship was **clear** of the reef.*

decided	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very decided.</i>
<u>definite</u>	Having exact and discernible physical limits or form. <i>It is definite that they have won.</i>
design	Create the design for create or execute in an artistic or highly skilled manner. <i>Inside the design reverts to turn of the century lux.</i>
determinate	(of a flowering shoot) having the main axis ending in a flower bud and therefore no longer extending in length, as in a cyme. <i>Determinate variations in animals.</i>
<u>diagram</u>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. <i>A diagram of the living room.</i>
<u>drawing</u>	The art or activity of making drawings. <i>A series of charcoal drawings on white paper.</i>
eidetic	Relating to or denoting mental images having unusual vividness and detail, as if actually visible. <i>An eidetic memory.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Explicit instructions.</i>
folio	A book or manuscript made up of folio sheets of paper a volume of the largest standard size. <i>The first folio of Shakespeare's plays.</i>
hardware	The machines, wiring, and other physical components of a computer or other electronic system. <i>High tech military hardware.</i>
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An indubitable truth.</i>
kaleidoscope	A constantly changing pattern or sequence of elements. <i>The dancers moved in a kaleidoscope of colour.</i>
limpid	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>Limpid blue eyes.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. <i>A pellucid brook.</i>

perspicuous	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more perspicuous explanations than its rivals.</i>
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
<u>schematic</u>	In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit. <i>Freeman constructs a highly schematic reading of the play.</i>
<u>straightforward</u>	Pointed directly ahead. <i>A straightforward gaze.</i>
<u>sure</u>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was on sure ground.</i>
<u>unambiguous</u>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>An unequivocal or univocal statement.</i>
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable.</i>
<u>vivid</u>	Having striking color. <i>A vivid recollection.</i>
