<b>depictive</b>	Depicted in a recognizable manner.
<b>detailed</b>	Having many details or facts; showing attention to detail. <i>More <b>detailed</b> information was needed.</i>
<b>diagrammatic</b>	Shown or represented by diagrams. <i>A <b>diagrammatic</b> representation of the system.</i>
<b>drawn</b>	(of a person) looking strained from illness, exhaustion, anxiety, or pain. <i>Her face was <b>drawn</b> and haggard from sleeplessness.</i>
<b><u>explicit</u></b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Let me be <b>explicit</b>.</i>
<b><u>expressive</u></b>	Conveying (a specified quality or idea). <i>She has big <b>expressive</b> eyes.</i>



<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>She was a <b>forceful</b> personality.</i>
<b>graphical</b>	Relating to visual art or computer graphics. <i>A high resolution <b>graphical</b> display.</i>
<u><b>illustrative</b></u>	Clarifying by use of examples. <i>This timetable is provided for <b>illustrative</b> purposes only.</i>
<b>in writing</b>	Currently fashionable.
<b>lifelike</b>	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>The artist had etched a <b>lifelike</b> horse.</i>
<b>pictorial</b>	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i><b>Pictorial</b> poetry and prose.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>A <b>powerful</b> bomb.</i>
<b>punchy</b>	Having an immediate impact; forceful. <i>His style is journalistic with short <b>punchy</b> sentences.</i>
<u><b>striking</b></u>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. <i>It is <b>striking</b> that no research into the problem is being carried out.</i>
<u><b>symbolic</b></u>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. <i>A repeating design <b>symbolic</b> of eternity.</i>
<u><b>uninhibited</b></u>	Not inhibited or restrained. <i>A naturally <b>uninhibited</b> sexuality.</i>
<u><b>visual</b></u>	Visible- Shakespeare. <i><b>Visual</b> perception.</i>
<u><b>vivid</b></u>	Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. <i>The rhododendron bush provides a <b>vivid</b> splash of mauve.</i>
<u><b>written</b></u>	Written as for a film or play or broadcast. <i><b>Written</b> laws.</i>

<b>decided</b>	Recognizable; marked. <i>You could never talk him round he was very <b>decided</b>.</i>
<b><u>definite</u></b>	Having exact and discernible physical limits or form. <i>It is <b>definite</b> that they have won.</i>
<b>design</b>	Create the design for create or execute in an artistic or highly skilled manner. <i>Inside the <b>design</b> reverts to turn of the century luxe.</i>
<b>determinate</b>	(of a flowering shoot) having the main axis ending in a flower bud and therefore no longer extending in length, as in a cyme. <i><b>Determinate</b> variations in animals.</i>
<b><u>diagram</u></b>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. <i>A <b>diagram</b> of the living room.</i>
<b><u>drawing</u></b>	The art or activity of making drawings. <i>A series of charcoal <b>drawings</b> on white paper.</i>
<b>eidetic</b>	Relating to or denoting mental images having unusual vividness and detail, as if actually visible. <i>An <b>eidetic</b> memory.</i>
<b><u>explicit</u></b>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i><b>Explicit</b> instructions.</i>
<b>folio</b>	A book or manuscript made up of folio sheets of paper a volume of the largest standard size. <i>The first <b>folio</b> of Shakespeare s plays.</i>
<b>hardware</b>	The machines, wiring, and other physical components of a computer or other electronic system. <i>High tech military <b>hardware</b>.</i>
<b>indubitable</b>	Too obvious to be doubted. <i>An <b>indubitable</b> truth.</i>
<b>kaleidoscope</b>	A constantly changing pattern or sequence of elements. <i>The dancers moved in a <b>kaleidoscope</b> of colour.</i>
<b>limpid</b>	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i><b>Limpid</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>palpability</b>	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
<b>pellucid</b>	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. <i>A <b>pellucid</b> brook.</i>



<b>perspicuous</b>	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>It provides simpler and more <b>perspicuous</b> explanations than its rivals.</i>
<b>positivistic</b>	Of or relating to positivism.
<b><u>schematic</u></b>	In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit. <i>Freeman constructs a highly <b>schematic</b> reading of the play.</i>
<b><u>straightforward</u></b>	Pointed directly ahead. <i>A <b>straightforward</b> gaze.</i>
<b><u>sure</u></b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was on <b>sure</b> ground.</i>
<b><u>unambiguous</u></b>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely <b>unambiguous</b>.</i>
<b><u>unequivocal</u></b>	Clearly defined or formulated. <i>An <b>unequivocal</b> or univocal statement.</i>
<b><u>unmistakable</u></b>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was <b>unmistakable</b>.</i>
<b><u>vivid</u></b>	Having striking color. <i>A <b>vivid</b> recollection.</i>
