picture	The cinema. They could still receive the sound but the picture was gone.







delineative	Depicted in a recognizable manner.
depictive	Depicted in a recognizable manner.
detailed	Having many details or facts; showing attention to detail. More detailed information was needed.
diagrammatic	Shown or represented by diagrams. A diagrammatic representation of the system.
drawn	(of a person) looking strained from illness, exhaustion, anxiety, or pain. <i>Her face was drawn and haggard from sleeplessness.</i>
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Let me be</i> explicit .
<u>expressive</u>	Conveying (a specified quality or idea. She has big expressive eyes.



forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. She was a forceful personality.
graphical	Relating to visual art or computer graphics. A high resolution graphical display.
<u>illustrative</u>	Clarifying by use of examples. This timetable is provided for illustrative purposes only.
in writing	Currently fashionable.
lifelike	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. The artist had etched a lifelike horse.
pictorial	Evoking lifelike images within the mind. <i>Pictorial poetry and prose.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. A powerful bomb.
punchy	Having an immediate impact; forceful. His style is journalistic with short punchy sentences.
<u>striking</u>	Sensational in appearance or thrilling in effect. It is striking that no research into the problem is being carried out.
<u>symbolic</u>	Involving the use of symbols or symbolism. A repeating design symbolic of eternity.
<u>uninhibited</u>	Not inhibited or restrained. A naturally uninhibited sexuality.
<u>visual</u>	Visible- Shakespeare. <i>Visual perception.</i>
<u>vivid</u>	Producing powerful feelings or strong, clear images in the mind. The rhododendron bush provides a vivid splash of mauve.
<u>written</u>	Written as for a film or play or broadcast. Written laws.

determinate	(of a flowering shoot) having the main axis ending in a flower bud and therefore no longer extending in length, as in a cyme. Determinate variations in animals.
<u>diagram</u>	Schedule the operations of a locomotive or train according to a diagram. A diagram of the living room.
<u>drawing</u>	The art or activity of making drawings. A series of charcoal drawing s on white paper.
eidetic	Relating to or denoting mental images having unusual vividness and detail, as if actually visible. An eidetic memory.
<u>explicit</u>	Of a person stating something in an explicit manner. <i>Explicit</i> instructions.
folio	A book or manuscript made up of folio sheets of paper a volume of the largest standard size. The first folio of Shakespeare s plays.
hardware	The machines, wiring, and other physical components of a computer or other electronic system. <i>High tech military hardware</i> .
indubitable	Too obvious to be doubted. An indubitable truth.
kaleidoscope	A constantly changing pattern or sequence of elements. The dancers moved in a kaleidoscope of colour.
limpid	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. <i>Limpid</i> blue eyes.
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.
palpability	The quality of being perceivable by touch.
pellucid	(of language) transparently clear; easily understandable. A pellucid brook.



perspicuous	Transparently clear; easily understandable- Robert Burton. It provides simpler and more perspicuous explanations than its rivals.
positivistic	Of or relating to positivism.
<u>schematic</u>	In technical contexts a schematic diagram in particular of an electric or electronic circuit. Freeman constructs a highly schematic reading of the play.
<u>straightforward</u>	Pointed directly ahead. A straightforward gaze.
<u>sure</u>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Was on sure ground</i> .
<u>unambiguous</u>	Having or exhibiting a single clearly defined meaning. As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous .
<u>unequivocal</u>	Clearly defined or formulated. An unequivocal or univocal statement.
<u>unmistakable</u>	Not able to be mistaken for anything else; very distinctive. <i>His opposition to slavery was unmistakable</i> .
<u>vivid</u>	Having striking color. A vivid recollection.
