gladness	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
gratify	Give (someone) pleasure or satisfaction. Not all the sexual impulses can be gratified.
happiness	The state of being happy. She struggled to find happiness in her life.
happy	Well expressed and to the point. Spent many happy days on the beach.
<u>indulge</u>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>We indulged in a cream tea.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
joy	A thing that causes joy. A joy to behold.
<u>please</u>	Be the will of or have the will (to. Oh please is that meant to be a serious argument.
pleasure	Give sexual enjoyment or satisfaction to. The car makes driving in the city a pleasure .
rapture	A feeling of intense pleasure or joy. The tabloids went into rapture s about her.
rejoice	To express great joy. I love to rejoice their poor Hearts at this season.



satisfaction	The payment of a debt or fulfilment of an obligation or claim. We were unable to get satisfaction from the local store.
satisfy	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condtion ro restriction. Social services is trying to satisfy the needs of so many different groups.
