- blessedness** A state of supreme happiness.
- bliss** A state of extreme happiness.  
***Blissed** out hippies.*
- complacency** The feeling you have when you are satisfied with yourself.  
*The figures are better but there are no grounds for **complacency**.*
- content** The state of being contented with your situation in life.  
*A **contented** smile.*
- contentment** Happiness with one's situation in life.  
*He found **contentment** in living a simple life in the country.*
- delectation** Pleasure and delight.  
*They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our **delectation**.*

<b>delight</b>	Take delight in. <i>He <b>delights</b> in his granddaughter.</i>
<b>ecstasy</b>	A state of being carried away by overwhelming emotion. <i>There was a look of <b>ecstasy</b> on his face.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	Affording satisfaction or pleasure. <i>The company was <b>enjoyable</b>.</i>
<b>entertain</b>	Provide entertainment for. <i>A tremendous game that thoroughly <b>entertained</b> the crowd.</i>
<b>euphoria</b>	A feeling of great (usually exaggerated) elation. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>exult</b>	Feel extreme happiness or elation. <i>Who cannot <b>exult</b> in Spring.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Feeling pleasure or happiness. <i>A <b>glad</b> May morning.</i>
<b>gladness</b>	Experiencing joy and pleasure.
<b>gratify</b>	Give (someone) pleasure or satisfaction. <i>Not all the sexual impulses can be gratified.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	The state of being happy. <i>She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Well expressed and to the point. <i>Spent many <b>happy</b> days on the beach.</i>
<b>indulge</b>	Treat with excessive indulgence. <i>We <b>indulged</b> in a cream tea.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>A <b>joy</b> to behold.</i>
<b>please</b>	Be the will of or have the will (to). <i>Oh <b>please</b> is that meant to be a serious argument.</i>
<b>pleasure</b>	Give sexual enjoyment or satisfaction to. <i>The car makes driving in the city a <b>pleasure</b>.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	A feeling of intense pleasure or joy. <i>The tabloids went into <b>raptures</b> about her.</i>
<b>rejoice</b>	To express great joy. <i>I love to <b>rejoice</b> their poor Hearts at this season.</i>

- satisfaction** The payment of a debt or fulfilment of an obligation or claim.  
*We were unable to get **satisfaction** from the local store.*
- satisfy** Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction.  
*Social services is trying to **satisfy** the needs of so many different groups.*
- sensual** Sexually exciting or gratifying.  
*A **sensual** delight in eating.*
- thrilled** Feeling intense pleasurable excitement.
