Associations of "Greeted" (30 Words)

aloha	An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>From the first aloha everyone is friendly and attentive.</i>
applause	Approval or praise expressed by clapping. <i>They gave him a round of applause.</i>
bye	You advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a bye into the second round.</i>
cheerfully	In a way that inspires feelings of happiness. <i>A cheerfully decorated tram car.</i>
cordially	With intense feeling. <i>He was cordially detested for his brutality and injustice.</i>
courteously	In a polite manner.
curtsy	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a curtsy to him.</i>
gladly	Willingly or eagerly. <i>I would have gladly paid for it.</i>
goodbye	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our goodbyes and set off.</i>
greeting	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>She raised her hand in greeting.</i>
handshake	An act of shaking a person’s hand with one’s own as a greeting.
happily	It is fortunate that. <i>Eleanor giggled happily.</i>
heartily	With gusto and without reservation. <i>She laughed heartily.</i>
hello	An utterance of hello a greeting. <i>She was getting polite nods and hellos from people.</i>

hi	An expression of greeting.
<u>hospitable</u>	Friendly and welcoming to visitors or guests. <i>A hospitable environment.</i>
hospitality	Kindness in welcoming guests or strangers. <i>Scotland is renowned for its hospitality.</i>
kissing	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<u>luckily</u>	It is fortunate that. <i>Luckily for me it s worked out.</i>
married	Married people. <i>A married couple.</i>
politely	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>I politely thanked him for the suggestion.</i>
<u>receptive</u>	(of a female animal) ready to mate. <i>Receptive to the proposals.</i>
recognize	Show approval or appreciation of. <i>We do not recognize your gods.</i>
salutation	A standard formula of words used in a letter to address the person being written to. <i>We would not expect a love letter to include a formal address and salutation.</i>
salute	Make a formal salute to. <i>When the officers show up the soldiers have to salute.</i>
smile	Express with a smile. <i>She greeted us all with a smile.</i>
<u>thankfully</u>	In a thankful manner; with thanks. <i>She thankfully accepted the armchair she was offered.</i>
welcome	The state of being welcome. <i>I m pleased to see you lad you re welcome.</i>
<u>welcoming</u>	Very cordial. <i>A welcoming smile.</i>
<u>willingly</u>	Readily; of one's own free will. <i>I willingly accept.</i>
