## Associations of "Greeted" (30 Words)

<b>aloha</b>	An acknowledgment that can be used to say hello or goodbye aloha is Hawaiian and ciao is Italian. <i>From the first <b>aloha</b> everyone is friendly and attentive.</i>
<b>applause</b>	Approval or praise expressed by clapping. <i>They gave him a round of <b>applause</b>.</i>
<b>bye</b>	You advance to the next round in a tournament without playing an opponent. <i>He has a <b>bye</b> into the second round.</i>
<b>cheerfully</b>	In a way that inspires feelings of happiness. <i>A <b>cheerfully</b> decorated tram car.</i>
<b>cordially</b>	With intense feeling. <i>He was <b>cordially</b> detested for his brutality and injustice.</i>
<b>courteously</b>	In a polite manner.
<b>curtsy</b>	Make a curtsy usually done only by girls and women as a sign of respect. <i>She bobbed a <b>curtsy</b> to him.</i>
<b>gladly</b>	Willingly or eagerly. <i>I would have <b>gladly</b> paid for it.</i>
<b>goodbye</b>	An instance of saying goodbye a parting. <i>We said our <b>goodbyes</b> and set off.</i>
<b>greeting</b>	A polite word or sign of welcome or recognition. <i>She raised her hand in <b>greeting</b>.</i>
<b>handshake</b>	An act of shaking a person’s hand with one’s own as a greeting.
<b>happily</b>	It is fortunate that. <i>Eleanor giggled <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b>heartily</b>	With gusto and without reservation. <i>She laughed <b>heartily</b>.</i>
<b>hello</b>	An utterance of hello a greeting. <i>She was getting polite nods and <b>hellos</b> from people.</i>

<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b><u>hospitable</u></b>	Friendly and welcoming to visitors or guests. <i>A <b>hospitable</b> environment.</i>
<b>hospitality</b>	Kindness in welcoming guests or strangers. <i>Scotland is renowned for its <b>hospitality</b>.</i>
<b>kissing</b>	Affectionate play (or foreplay without contact with the genital organs).
<b><u>luckily</u></b>	It is fortunate that. <i><b>Luckily</b> for me it s worked out.</i>
<b>married</b>	Married people. <i>A <b>married</b> couple.</i>
<b>politely</b>	In a respectful and considerate manner. <i>I <b>politely</b> thanked him for the suggestion.</i>
<b><u>receptive</u></b>	(of a female animal) ready to mate. <i><b>Receptive</b> to the proposals.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Show approval or appreciation of. <i>We do not <b>recognize</b> your gods.</i>
<b>salutation</b>	A standard formula of words used in a letter to address the person being written to. <i>We would not expect a love letter to include a formal address and <b>salutation</b>.</i>
<b>salute</b>	Make a formal salute to. <i>When the officers show up the soldiers have to <b>salute</b>.</i>
<b>smile</b>	Express with a smile. <i>She greeted us all with a <b>smile</b>.</i>
<b><u>thankfully</u></b>	In a thankful manner; with thanks. <i>She <b>thankfully</b> accepted the armchair she was offered.</i>
<b>welcome</b>	The state of being welcome. <i>I m pleased to see you lad you re <b>welcome</b>.</i>
<b><u>welcoming</u></b>	Very cordial. <i>A <b>welcoming</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>willingly</u></b>	Readily; of one's own free will. <i>I <b>willingly</b> accept.</i>
