adolescent	An adolescent boy or girl. <i>Many parents find it hard to understand their adolescent children.</i>
adult	Of or for adult people. <i>An adult woman.</i>
bare	Just barely adequate or within a lower limit. <i>All you need to get started with this program is a bare 10K bytes of memory.</i>
bloom	Reproductive organ of angiosperm plants especially one having showy or colorful parts. <i>The children had bloomed in the soft Devonshire air.</i>
boom	Hit hard. <i>The deep boom of the bass drum.</i>
burgeon	Begin to grow or increase rapidly; flourish. <i>The city's suburbs have burgeoned sprawling out from the centre.</i>
develop	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>We have developed a new theory of evolution.</i>
development	A recent event that has some relevance for the present situation. <i>He proposed an indicator of osseous development in children.</i>
ding	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were dinging softly.</i>
flourish	Grow vigorously. <i>She entered with a great flourish.</i>
germinate	Produce buds branches or germinate. <i>The plentiful rain germinated my plants.</i>

growing	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the growing child.</i>
grown	(of animals) fully developed. <i>A grown woman.</i>
growth	The process of developing physically, mentally, or spiritually. <i>Some additives slow down the growth of microorganisms.</i>
<u>inflation</u>	A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>The inflation of a balloon.</i>
maturation	The action or process of maturing. <i>White wines generally need less maturation than reds.</i>
maturational	Relating to or involved in maturation.
mature	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>He has matured and is ready to take on new responsibilities.</i>
<u>maturity</u>	An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. <i>Interest is not paid until maturity.</i>
prosper	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>God has wonderfully prospered this nation.</i>
puberty	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic puberty.</i>
sere	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with sere vegetation.</i>
stripling	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i>
teen	Relating to teenagers. <i>A teen idol.</i>
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A teenage girl.</i>
<u>teenager</u>	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
<u>thrive</u>	(of a child, animal, or plant) grow or develop well or vigorously. <i>Education groups thrive on organization.</i>
unaided	Needing or having no assistance; without help. <i>She can no longer walk unaided.</i>
