| germinate | Produce buds branches or germinate. <i>The plentiful rain germinated my plants.</i> |

| growth | The process of developing physically, mentally, or spiritually. <i>Some additives slow down the growth of microorganisms.</i> |
| <u>inflation</u> | A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>The inflation of a balloon.</i> |
| maturation | The action or process of maturing. <i>White wines generally need less maturation than reds.</i> |
| maturational | Relating to or involved in maturation. |
| mature | Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>He has matured and is ready to take on new responsibilities.</i> |
| <u>maturity</u> | An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. <i>Interest is not paid until maturity.</i> |
| prosper | Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>God has wonderfully prospered this nation.</i> |
| puberty | The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic puberty.</i> |
