<b><a href="#">bloom</a></b>	Reproductive organ of angiosperm plants especially one having showy or colorful parts. <i>The children had <b>bloomed</b> in the soft Devonshire air.</i>
<b><a href="#">boom</a></b>	Hit hard. <i>The deep <b>boom</b> of the bass drum.</i>
<b><a href="#">burgeon</a></b>	Begin to grow or increase rapidly; flourish. <i>The city's suburbs have <b>burgeoned</b> sprawling out from the centre.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>We have <b>developed</b> a new theory of evolution.</i>
<b>development</b>	A recent event that has some relevance for the present situation. <i>He proposed an indicator of osseous <b>development</b> in children.</i>
<b>ding</b>	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were <b>dinging</b> softly.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	Grow vigorously. <i>She entered with a great <b>flourish</b>.</i>
<b>germinate</b>	Produce buds branches or germinate. <i>The plentiful rain <b>germinated</b> my plants.</i>

<b>growing</b>	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the <b>growing</b> child.</i>
<b>grown</b>	(of animals) fully developed. <i>A <b>grown</b> woman.</i>
<b>growth</b>	The process of developing physically, mentally, or spiritually. <i>Some additives slow down the <b>growth</b> of microorganisms.</i>
<b><u>inflation</u></b>	A general and progressive increase in prices. <i>The <b>inflation</b> of a balloon.</i>
<b>maturation</b>	The action or process of maturing. <i>White wines generally need less <b>maturation</b> than reds.</i>
<b>maturational</b>	Relating to or involved in maturation.
<b>mature</b>	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>He has <b>matured</b> and is ready to take on new responsibilities.</i>
<b><u>maturity</u></b>	An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. <i>Interest is not paid until <b>maturity</b>.</i>
<b>prosper</b>	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. <i>God has wonderfully <b>prospered</b> this nation.</i>
<b>puberty</b>	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic <b>puberty</b>.</i>
<b>sere</b>	Having lost all moisture. <i>The desert was edged with <b>sere</b> vegetation.</i>
<b>stripling</b>	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere <b>stripling</b>.</i>
<b>teen</b>	Relating to teenagers. <i>A <b>teen</b> idol.</i>
<b>teenage</b>	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i>A <b>teenage</b> girl.</i>
<b><u>teenager</u></b>	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
<b><u>thrive</u></b>	(of a child, animal, or plant) grow or develop well or vigorously. <i>Education groups <b>thrive</b> on organization.</i>
<b>unaided</b>	Needing or having no assistance; without help. <i>She can no longer walk <b>unaided</b>.</i>
