growing	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. The needs of the growing child.
grown	(of animals) fully developed. A grown woman.
growth	The process of developing physically, mentally, or spiritually. <i>Some additives slow down the growth of microorganisms.</i>
<u>inflation</u>	A general and progressive increase in prices. The inflation of a balloon.
maturation	The action or process of maturing. White wines generally need less maturation than reds.
maturational	Relating to or involved in maturation.
mature	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used. <i>He has matured and is ready to take on new responsibilities.</i>
<u>maturity</u>	An insurance policy security etc having a fixed maturity date. Interest is not paid until maturity .
prosper	Flourish physically; grow strong and healthy. God has wonderfully prosper ed this nation.
puberty	The period during which adolescents reach sexual maturity and become capable of reproduction. <i>A particularly traumatic puberty</i> .
sere	Having lost all moisture. The desert was edged with sere vegetation.
stripling	A juvenile between the onset of puberty and maturity. <i>He s a mere stripling.</i>
teen	Relating to teenagers. A teen idol.
teenage	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. A teenage girl.
<u>teenager</u>	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
<u>thrive</u>	(of a child, animal, or plant) grow or develop well or vigorously. <i>Education groups thrive on organization.</i>
unaided	Needing or having no assistance; without help. She can no longer walk unaided .
