An angry or bad-tempered expression.


She stamped into the room with a **scowl** on her face.

He acknowledged their presence with a condescending **sneer**.




wince A reflex response to sudden pain.

Definitions of "Grimace" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "grimace" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Contort the face to indicate a certain mental or emotional state.
- Make a grimace.





Synonyms of "Grimace" as a verb (9 Words)

frown

Look angry or sullen, wrinkle one's forehead, as if to signal disapproval.

He **frown**ed as he reread the letter.

glower Look angry or sullen, wrinkle one's forehead, as if to signal disapproval.

She **glower**ed at him suspiciously.

lour Look angry or sullen, wrinkle one's forehead, as if to signal disapproval.

make a face Reach in time.



poutMake a sad face and thrust out one's lower lip.

The girl **pout**ed.

pull a face Take sides with; align oneself with; show strong sympathy for.

Frown in an angry or bad-tempered way.

She **scowl**ed at him defiantly.


Smile contemptuously.

She had **sneer**ed at their bad taste.

Make a face indicating disgust or dislike.

She **wince**d when she heard his pompous speech.








Usage Examples of "Grimace" as a verb

affliction An instance of one celestial body afflicting another.

agonize Cause to agonize.

He crashed to the ground in **agony**.



Cause emotional anguish or make miserable. <u>anguish</u>

She shut her eyes in **anguish**.

Inflict a bruise or bruises on a part of the body. bruise

Rub (a part of the body) to restore warmth or sensation.

chafe To prevent **chafe** the ropes should lie flat.

Fasten with a cramp or cramps. cramp

Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. distress

dolor (poetry) painful grief.

Strip the skin off (a corpse or carcass. flay

The captured general was **flay**ed alive.

Affected by frostbite from exposure to extreme cold. frostbitten

Frostbitten grapes unsalable as fresh fruit.

The act of tormenting by continued persistent attacks and criticism. harassment

They face daily **harassment** and assault on the streets.

Provide a cure for make healthy again. heal

His concern is to **heal** sick people.

The quality of being oppressive or overpowering to the senses. **heaviness**

Nothing lifted the **heaviness** of her heart after her loss.

Impose something unwelcome on. inflict

They **inflict**ed serious injuries on three other men.

itching An irritating cutaneous sensation that produces a desire to scratch.

A cause or source of great distress or discomfort. **misery**

The **misery** of the miner s existence.

pain It **pain**s me to see my children not being taught well in school.

Cause to suffer.

scratch

persecute No one should be **persecute**d for their religious beliefs.

A technique used especially in rap music of stopping a record by hand and

moving it back and forwards to give a rhythmic scratching effect.

Many architects now **scratch** along doing loft conversions.

Psychological suffering.

suffering Weapons that cause unnecessary **suffering**.

A design on the skin made by tattooing.

tattoo She tapped her fingers in a nervous **tattoo**.



A feeling of pain in a series of regular beats. throb

He felt a **throb**bing in his head.

An ache localized in or around a tooth. toothache

I ve got **toothache**.

A feeling of intense annoyance caused by being tormented. torment

The sinners will be **torment**ed in Hell according to the Bible.

Subject to torture. **torture** A **torture** chamber.

Characterized by or indicative of distress or affliction or danger or need. troubled

His **troubled** face.

Things that cause sorrow or distress; troubles. woe

To add to his **woe**s customers have been spending less.

wretchedness A state of ill-being due to affliction or misfortune.
