Definitions of "Grin" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "grin" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- To draw back the lips and reveal the teeth, in a smile, grimace, or snarl.
- Smile broadly.
- Express with a broad smile.
- Grimace grotesquely so as to reveal the teeth.

Full of or showing high-spirited merriment.

A merry evening.

mischievous Naughtily or annoyingly playful.

Mischievous rumors and falsehoods.

Giving or expressing pleasure and amusement.

He gave me a **playful** punch on the arm.

pleasure Sexual gratification.

Risky verbal exchanges that the pair might **pleasure** in.

prankster A person fond of playing pranks.

puckish Playful, especially in a mischievous way.
