bonus	A distribution of profits to holders of an insurance policy. <i>Big Christmas bonuses.</i>
cash	Exchange for cash. <i>A discount for cash.</i>
customs	The place at a port, airport, or frontier where officials check incoming goods, travellers, or luggage. <i>We were through customs with a minimum of formalities.</i>
detestable	Unequivocally detestable. <i>I found the film s violence detestable.</i>
disgusting	Arousing revulsion or strong indignation. <i>I think the decision is disgusting.</i>
dividend	An individual s share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay dividends.</i>
earned	Gained or acquired; especially through merit or as a result of effort or action. <i>A well earned reputation for honesty.</i>
earnings	Money obtained in return for labour or services. <i>He claimed damages for loss of earnings.</i>
execrable	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i>Execrable cheap wine.</i>
fee	A payment made to a professional person or to a professional or public body in exchange for advice or services. <i>They were faced with legal fees of 3000.</i>
gain	Rise in rate or price. <i>We gained entry to the car in five seconds.</i>
hateful	Arousing, deserving of, or filled with hatred. <i>A hateful thing to do.</i>

<u>income</u>	The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate income.</i>
loathsome	Causing hatred or disgust; repulsive. <i>A loathsome disease.</i>
nauseating	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>A nauseating smell.</i>
odious	Unequivocally detestable. <i>Odious hypocrisy.</i>
overpayment	Payment in excess of what is due. <i>He received 20 000 in benefit overpayments.</i>
paycheck	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
payroll	The total amount of wages paid by a company. <i>Small employers with a payroll of less than 45 000.</i>
redistribute	Distribute anew. <i>Their primary concern was to redistribute income from rich to poor.</i>
redistribution	The distribution of something in a different way, typically to achieve greater social equality. <i>A government land redistribution policy.</i>
<u>revenue</u>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government revenue and to lower expenditure.</i>
sales	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<u>seller</u>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>The book became the biggest seller in the history of royal publishing.</i>
taxation	Government income due to taxation. <i>The progressive nature of taxation.</i>
tonnage	A tax imposed on ships that enter the US based on the tonnage of the ship. <i>Road convoys carry more tonnage.</i>
<u>total</u>	Comprising the whole number or amount. <i>My son totalled our new car.</i>
turnover	The ratio of the number of workers that had to be replaced in a given time period to the average number of workers. <i>The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid turnovers.</i>
vat	Place or treat in a vat. <i>A vat of hot tar.</i>

wage

A fixed regular payment earned for work or services, typically paid on a daily or weekly basis.

*Napoleon and Hitler **waged** war against all of Europe.*
