## Associations of "Grossly" (30 Words)

<b>bonus</b>	A distribution of profits to holders of an insurance policy. <i>Big Christmas <b>bonuses</b>.</i>
<b>cash</b>	Exchange for cash. <i>A discount for <b>cash</b>.</i>
<b>customs</b>	The place at a port, airport, or frontier where officials check incoming goods, travellers, or luggage. <i>We were through <b>customs</b> with a minimum of formalities.</i>
<b>detestable</b>	Unequivocally detestable. <i>I found the film s violence <b>detestable</b>.</i>
<b>disgusting</b>	Arousing revulsion or strong indignation. <i>I think the decision is <b>disgusting</b>.</i>
<b>dividend</b>	An individual s share of a dividend. <i>Buying a rail pass may still pay <b>dividends</b>.</i>
<b>earned</b>	Gained or acquired; especially through merit or as a result of effort or action. <i>A well <b>earned</b> reputation for honesty.</i>
<b>earnings</b>	Money obtained in return for labour or services. <i>He claimed damages for loss of <b>earnings</b>.</i>
<b>execrable</b>	Unequivocally detestable- Edmund Burke. <i><b>Execrable</b> cheap wine.</i>
<b>fee</b>	A payment made to a professional person or to a professional or public body in exchange for advice or services. <i>They were faced with legal <b>fees</b> of 3000.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Rise in rate or price. <i>We <b>gained</b> entry to the car in five seconds.</i>
<b>hateful</b>	Arousing, deserving of, or filled with hatred. <i>A <b>hateful</b> thing to do.</i>

<b>income</b>	The financial gain (earned or unearned) accruing over a given period of time. <i>He has a nice home and an adequate <b>income</b>.</i>
<b>loathsome</b>	Causing hatred or disgust; repulsive. <i>A <b>loathsome</b> disease.</i>
<b>nauseating</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>A <b>nauseating</b> smell.</i>
<b>odious</b>	Unequivocally detestable. <i><b>Odious</b> hypocrisy.</i>
<b>overpayment</b>	Payment in excess of what is due. <i>He received 20 000 in benefit <b>overpayments</b>.</i>
<b>paycheck</b>	A check issued in payment of wages or salary.
<b>payroll</b>	The total amount of wages paid by a company. <i>Small employers with a <b>payroll</b> of less than 45 000.</i>
<b>redistribute</b>	Distribute anew. <i>Their primary concern was to <b>redistribute</b> income from rich to poor.</i>
<b>redistribution</b>	The distribution of something in a different way, typically to achieve greater social equality. <i>A government land <b>redistribution</b> policy.</i>
<b>revenue</b>	The department of the civil service collecting state revenue. <i>His priority was to raise government <b>revenue</b> and to lower expenditure.</i>
<b>sales</b>	Income (at invoice values) received for goods and services over some given period of time.
<b>seller</b>	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>The book became the biggest <b>seller</b> in the history of royal publishing.</i>
<b>taxation</b>	Government income due to taxation. <i>The progressive nature of <b>taxation</b>.</i>
<b>tonnage</b>	A tax imposed on ships that enter the US based on the tonnage of the ship. <i>Road convoys carry more <b>tonnage</b>.</i>
<b>total</b>	Comprising the whole number or amount. <i>My son <b>totalled</b> our new car.</i>
<b>turnover</b>	The ratio of the number of workers that had to be replaced in a given time period to the average number of workers. <i>The team were sitting on their lead and taking care to avoid <b>turnovers</b>.</i>
<b>vat</b>	Place or treat in a vat. <i>A <b>vat</b> of hot tar.</i>

**wage**

A fixed regular payment earned for work or services, typically paid on a daily or weekly basis.

*Napoleon and Hitler **waged** war against all of Europe.*
