incredible Impossible to believe.

At **incredible** speed.

ludicrous Broadly or extravagantly humorous; resembling farce.

Ludicrous green hair.

malformed So badly formed or out of shape as to be ugly.

A limp caused by a **malformed** foot.

mangled Having edges that are jagged from injury.

misproportioned Badly or wrongly proportioned.

misshapen Not having the normal or natural shape or form.

Misshapen old fingers.

Abnormally large.

monstrous

Monstrous bug eyed fish.

mutilated Having a part of the body crippled or disabled.

Wildly exaggerated or improbable.

outrageous

Spends an outrageous amount on entertainment.

preposterousContrary to reason or common sense; utterly absurd or ridiculous.

A **preposterous** attempt to turn back the pages of history.

ridiculous It seems absolutely ridiculous that anyone would try to pull a stunt like

this.

Giving offense to moral sensibilities and injurious to reputation-

shocking Thackeray.

Shocking behaviour.

twisted Having an intended meaning altered or misrepresented.

Many of the facts seemed **twisted** out of any semblance to reality.

unbelievableBeyond belief or understanding.

Your audacity is **unbelievable**.

unthinkable Incapable of being conceived or considered. *It was unthinkable that John could be dead.*
