Associations of "Grounded" (30 Words)

basilar	Of or situated at the base of something, especially of the skull, or of the organ of Corti in the ear. <i>The basilar membrane of the cochlea.</i>
burial	A ceremony at which someone's body is buried; a funeral. <i>His remains were shipped home for burial.</i>
bury	Embed deeply. <i>He ran through to bury a right foot shot inside the near post.</i>
casket	Enclose in a casket. <i>A small brass casket containing four black opals.</i>
cemetery	A large burial ground, especially one not in a churchyard. <i>A military cemetery.</i>
coffin	Place into a coffin. <i>The young man was coffined decently.</i>
cornerstone	An important quality or feature on which a particular thing depends or is based. <i>A national minimum wage remained the cornerstone of policy.</i>
crypt	A small tubular gland, pit, or recess.
entomb	Place (a dead body) in a tomb. <i>The pharaohs were entombed in the pyramids.</i>
epigraph	A quotation at the beginning of some piece of writing.
epitaph	An inscription on a tombstone or monument in memory of the person buried there. <i>The story makes a sorry epitaph to a great career.</i>
foundation	An institution supported by an endowment. <i>The foundation of a civil service college.</i>
grave	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. <i>The coffin was lowered into the grave.</i>

gravestone	An inscribed headstone marking a grave.
inhume	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>No hand his bones shall gather or inhume.</i>
inter	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>He was interred with the military honours due to him.</i>
interment	The ritual placing of a corpse in a grave. <i>The day of interment.</i>
mausoleum	A stately or impressive building housing a tomb or group of tombs. <i>A cultural mausoleum such as the Tate.</i>
mortician	One whose business is the management of funerals.
mummification	(pathology) gangrene that develops in the presence of arterial obstruction and is characterized by dryness of the dead tissue and a dark brown color. <i>Bureaucratic mummification in red tape.</i>
necropolis	A tract of land used for burials.
pharaoh	A ruler in ancient Egypt. <i>The time of the pharaohs.</i>
plaque	A small, distinct, typically raised patch or region on or within the body resulting from local damage or deposition of material, such as a fatty deposit on an artery wall in atherosclerosis or a site of localized damage of brain tissue in Alzheimer's disease. <i>Plaque around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
quietus	Euphemisms for death (based on an analogy between lying in a bed and in a tomb).
sarcophagus	A stone coffin, typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription and associated with the ancient civilizations of Egypt, Rome, and Greece.
sepulcher	A chamber that is used as a grave.
<u>slide</u>	A transparency mounted in a frame viewed with a slide projector. <i>His slide didn't stop until the bottom of the hill.</i>
<u>slither</u>	A slithering movement. <i>A snake like slither across the grass.</i>
<u>tomb</u>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>The house was as quiet as a tomb.</i>
tombstone	Jump into the sea from a cliff or other high point. <i>Thrill seeking lads tombstoned off the rocks.</i>
