## Associations of "Grounded" (30 Words)

<b>basilar</b>	Of or situated at the base of something, especially of the skull, or of the organ of Corti in the ear. <i>The <b>basilar</b> membrane of the cochlea.</i>
<b>burial</b>	A ceremony at which someone’s body is buried; a funeral. <i>His remains were shipped home for <b>burial</b>.</i>
<a href="#">bury</a>	Embed deeply. <i>He ran through to <b>bury</b> a right foot shot inside the near post.</i>
<b>casket</b>	Enclose in a casket. <i>A small brass <b>casket</b> containing four black opals.</i>
<a href="#">cemetery</a>	A large burial ground, especially one not in a churchyard. <i>A military <b>cemetery</b>.</i>
<a href="#">coffin</a>	Place into a coffin. <i>The young man was <b>coffined</b> decently.</i>
<a href="#">cornerstone</a>	An important quality or feature on which a particular thing depends or is based. <i>A national minimum wage remained the <b>cornerstone</b> of policy.</i>
<a href="#">crypt</a>	A small tubular gland, pit, or recess.
<b>entomb</b>	Place (a dead body) in a tomb. <i>The pharaohs were <b>entombed</b> in the pyramids.</i>
<b>epigraph</b>	A quotation at the beginning of some piece of writing.
<a href="#">epitaph</a>	An inscription on a tombstone or monument in memory of the person buried there. <i>The story makes a sorry <b>epitaph</b> to a great career.</i>
<b>foundation</b>	An institution supported by an endowment. <i>The <b>foundation</b> of a civil service college.</i>
<a href="#">grave</a>	Causing fear or anxiety by threatening great harm. <i>The coffin was lowered into the <b>grave</b>.</i>

<b>gravestone</b>	An inscribed headstone marking a grave.
<b>inhume</b>	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>No hand his bones shall gather or <b>inhume</b>.</i>
<b>inter</b>	Place in a grave or tomb. <i>He was <b>interred</b> with the military honours due to him.</i>
<b>interment</b>	The ritual placing of a corpse in a grave. <i>The day of <b>interment</b>.</i>
<b>mausoleum</b>	A stately or impressive building housing a tomb or group of tombs. <i>A cultural <b>mausoleum</b> such as the Tate.</i>
<b>mortician</b>	One whose business is the management of funerals.
<b>mummification</b>	(pathology) gangrene that develops in the presence of arterial obstruction and is characterized by dryness of the dead tissue and a dark brown color. <i>Bureaucratic <b>mummification</b> in red tape.</i>
<b>necropolis</b>	A tract of land used for burials.
<b>pharaoh</b>	A ruler in ancient Egypt. <i>The time of the <b>pharaohs</b>.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	A small, distinct, typically raised patch or region on or within the body resulting from local damage or deposition of material, such as a fatty deposit on an artery wall in atherosclerosis or a site of localized damage of brain tissue in Alzheimer's disease. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>quietus</b>	Euphemisms for death (based on an analogy between lying in a bed and in a tomb).
<b>sarcophagus</b>	A stone coffin, typically adorned with a sculpture or inscription and associated with the ancient civilizations of Egypt, Rome, and Greece.
<b>sepulcher</b>	A chamber that is used as a grave.
<a href="#"><u>slide</u></a>	A transparency mounted in a frame viewed with a slide projector. <i>His <b>slide</b> didn't stop until the bottom of the hill.</i>
<a href="#"><u>slither</u></a>	A slithering movement. <i>A snake like <b>slither</b> across the grass.</i>
<a href="#"><u>tomb</u></a>	A place for the burial of a corpse especially beneath the ground and marked by a tombstone. <i>The house was as quiet as a <b>tomb</b>.</i>
<b>tombstone</b>	Jump into the sea from a cliff or other high point. <i>Thrill seeking lads <b>tombstoned</b> off the rocks.</i>
