<b>distasteful</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>He found such cynicism <b>distasteful</b>.</i>
<b><u>dreadful</u></b>	Very unpleasant. <i>There s been a <b>dreadful</b> accident.</i>
<b>fearful</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>fearful</b> howling.</i>
<b><u>filthy</u></b>	Obscene and offensive. <i>A <b>filthy</b> traitor.</i>
<b>foul</b>	Of a baseball not hit between the foul lines. <i>His <b>foul</b> breath.</i>
<b>frightful</b>	Extremely distressing. <i>A <b>frightful</b> crime of decapitation.</i>
<b><u>ghastly</u></b>	Very objectionable, bad, or unpleasant. <i>The weather was <b>ghastly</b>.</i>
<b><u>grim</u></b>	Very serious or gloomy. <i>She was looking <b>grim</b>.</i>
<b>grisly</b>	Causing horror or disgust. <i>A <b>grisly</b> murder.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>A <b>hideous</b> pattern of injustice.</i>
<b><u>horrendous</u></b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i><b>Horrendous</b> explosions shook the city.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>A <b>horrible</b> massacre.</i>
<b>horrid</b>	Exceedingly bad. <i>When she was bad she was <b>horrid</b>.</i>

<b>horrific</b>	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. <i><b>Horrific</b> injuries.</i>
<b>horrifying</b>	Provoking horror- Winston Churchill. <i>A <b>horrifying</b> incident.</i>
<b>loathsome</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>This <b>loathsome</b> little swine.</i>
<b>macabre</b>	Disturbing because concerned with or causing a fear of death. <i><b>Macabre</b> tales of war and plague in the Middle ages.</i>
<b>nauseating</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>A <b>nauseating</b> smell.</i>
<b>nauseous</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>This <b>nauseous</b> account of a court case.</i>
<b>objectionable</b>	Liable to objection or debate; used of something one might take exception to. <i>Found the politician s views <b>objectionable</b>.</i>
<b>obnoxious</b>	Causing disapproval or protest. <i><b>Obnoxious</b> odours.</i>
<b>odious</b>	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. <i>Consequences <b>odious</b> to those you govern.</i>
<b>off-putting</b>	Tending to repel- Elizabeth Hess.
<b>offensive</b>	Morally offensive. <i>The allegations made are deeply <b>offensive</b> to us.</i>
<b>repellent</b>	Highly offensive; arousing aversion or disgust. <i>A water <b>repellent</b> fabric.</i>
<b>repugnant</b>	Given to stubborn resistance. <i>Cannibalism seems <b>repugnant</b> to us.</i>
<b>repulsive</b>	So extremely ugly as to be terrifying. <i>A <b>repulsive</b> force.</i>
<b>revolting</b>	Causing intense disgust; disgusting. <i>There was a <b>revolting</b> smell that lingered in the air.</i>
<b>sick</b>	(of an organization, system, or society) suffering from serious problems. <i>Visiting the <b>sick</b> and the elderly.</i>
<b>sickening</b>	Causing or able to cause nausea. <i>A <b>sickening</b> stench of blood.</i>
<b>squalid</b>	Showing or involving a contemptible lack of moral standards. <i>The <b>squalid</b> atmosphere of intrigue and betrayal.</i>

<b>terrible</b>	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>A <b>terrible</b> crime.</i>
<b>unappetizing</b>	Not appetizing in appearance, aroma, or taste. <i>An <b>unappetizing</b> leg of chicken.</i>
<b>uninviting</b>	(especially of a place or prospect) not attractive. <i>The house was dark and <b>uninviting</b>.</i>
<b>unpalatable</b>	Not pleasant or acceptable to the taste or mind. <i>Scraps of <b>unpalatable</b> food.</i>
<b>unpleasant</b>	Disagreeable to the senses, to the mind, or feelings. <i><b>Unpleasant</b> odors.</i>
<b>unsavoury</b>	Not pleasing in odor or taste. <i>An <b>unsavoury</b> reputation.</i>
<b>vile</b>	Morally bad; wicked. <i>As <b>vile</b> a rogue as ever lived.</i>

<b>frightful</b>	Used for emphasis, especially of something bad. <i>Spent a <b>frightful</b> amount of money.</i>
<b>ghastly</b>	Gruesomely indicative of death or the dead. <i>A <b>ghastly</b> pallor.</i>
<b>grisly</b>	Causing horror or disgust. <i>The town was shaken by a series of <b>grisly</b> crimes.</i>
<b>hate</b>	Used politely to express one's regret or embarrassment at doing something. <i>I d <b>hate</b> to live there.</i>
<b>hellish</b>	Very unpleasant. <i>It was <b>hellish</b> expensive.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	So extremely ugly as to be terrifying. <i>A <b>hideous</b> scar.</i>
<b>horrible</b>	Very unpleasant. <i>War is beyond all words <b>horrible</b>.</i>
<b>horrific</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i><b>Horrific</b> conditions in the mining industry.</i>
<b>horrifying</b>	Provoking horror. <i>An alarming even <b>horrifying</b> picture.</i>
<b>infernal</b>	Being of the underworld. <i><b>Infernal</b> instruments of war.</i>
<b>loathing</b>	A feeling of intense dislike or disgust; hatred. <i>The thought filled him with <b>loathing</b>.</i>
<b>macabre</b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i>A <b>macabre</b> series of murders.</i>
<b>odious</b>	Extremely unpleasant; repulsive. <i><b>Odious</b> hypocrisy.</i>

<b>sepulchral</b>	Gloomy; dismal. <i>The <b>sepulchral</b> darkness of the catacombs.</i>
<b><u>spooky</u></b>	Easily frightened; nervous. <i>Some horses are more <b>spooky</b> by nature than others.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Causing or likely to cause terror; sinister. <i>A <b>terrible</b> cough.</i>
