**safeguard** Make safe.

A framework which **safeguard**s employees from exploitation.

safely In a way that is not likely to cause or lead to harm or injury.

You can **safely** ignore that advice.

The condition of being protected from or unlikely to cause danger, risk, or

**safety** injury.

They should leave for their own **safety**.

(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial

**<u>secretive</u>** quality.

She was very **secretive** about her past.

Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or

**security** organization.

The head of **security** was a former policeman.

**sentry** A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event.

On **sentry** duty.

**shelter** Provide shelter for.

People were **shelter**ing under store canopies and trees.

tenable (of an office, position, scholarship, etc.) able to be held or used.

Such a simplistic approach is no longer **tenable**.

tutelar Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding.

**Tutelar**y gods.

ward The grooves in the bit of a key that correspond to the wards in a lock.
