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## Associations of "Guards" (30 Words)

<b>bodyguard</b>	A group of men who escort and protect some important person.
<b>captor</b>	A person that catches or confines another. <i>He managed to escape from his <b>captors</b> two nights later.</i>
<b>chaperone</b>	Accompany as a chaperone. <i>She <b>chaperoned</b> the children at all times.</i>
<b>convoy</b>	A collection of merchant ships with an escort of warships. <i>The warships <b>convoyed</b> the merchant ships across the Pacific.</i>
<b>defence</b>	Protection from harm. <i>Wire netting is the best <b>defence</b> against rabbits.</i>
<b>defend</b>	Protect or fight for as a champion. <i>They were forced to <b>defend</b> for long periods.</i>
<b>defense</b>	An organization of defenders that provides resistance against attack. <i>A good boxer needs a good <b>defense</b>.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Capable of being defended. <i>A morally <b>defensible</b> penal system.</i>
<b>escape</b>	Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. <i>Their <b>escape</b> route.</i>
<b>guardian</b>	A person who cares for persons or property. <i>I am acting as <b>guardian</b> of my late brother s family.</i>
<b>guide</b>	Use as a guide. <i>A tour <b>guide</b>.</i>
<b>helmet</b>	A predatory mollusc with a squat heavy shell, which lives in tropical and temperate seas.
<b>preclusive</b>	Preventing something from happening; restrictive. <i>No <b>preclusive</b> action was taken.</i>

<b>preventive</b>	Designed to keep something undesirable such as illness or harm from occurring. <i>Quinine was used as a malaria <b>preventive</b>.</i>
<b>probation</b>	(law) a way of dealing with offenders without imprisoning them; a defendant found guilty of a crime is released by the court without imprisonment subject to conditions imposed by the court. <i>For an initial period of <b>probation</b> your manager will closely monitor your progress.</i>
<b>protect</b>	Use tariffs to favor domestic industry. <i>Security products are designed to <b>protect</b> information from unauthorized access.</i>
<b>protective</b>	Intended or adapted to afford protection of some kind. <i>The use of <b>protective</b> masks and equipment.</i>
<b>protector</b>	A person or thing that protects someone or something. <i>A man who became her <b>protector</b> adviser and friend.</i>
<b>safeguard</b>	Make safe. <i>A framework which <b>safeguards</b> employees from exploitation.</i>
<b>safely</b>	In a way that is not likely to cause or lead to harm or injury. <i>You can <b>safely</b> ignore that advice.</i>
<b>safety</b>	The condition of being protected from or unlikely to cause danger, risk, or injury. <i>They should leave for their own <b>safety</b>.</i>
<b>secretive</b>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. <i>She was very <b>secretive</b> about her past.</i>
<b>security</b>	Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or organization. <i>The head of <b>security</b> was a former policeman.</i>
<b>sentry</b>	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. <i>On <b>sentry</b> duty.</i>
<b>shelter</b>	Provide shelter for. <i>People were <b>sheltering</b> under store canopies and trees.</i>
<b>tenable</b>	(of an office, position, scholarship, etc.) able to be held or used. <i>Such a simplistic approach is no longer <b>tenable</b>.</i>
<b>tutelar</b>	Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding. <i><b>Tutelary</b> gods.</i>
<b>ward</b>	The grooves in the bit of a key that correspond to the wards in a lock. <i>I saw them keeping <b>ward</b> at one of those huge gates.</i>

**watchman** A man employed to look after an empty building, especially at night.  
*A night **watchman**.*
