**bodyguard** A group of men who escort and protect some important person. A person that catches or confines another. captor *He managed to escape from his captors two nights later.* chaperone Accompany as a chaperone. She **chaperone**d the children at all times. A collection of merchant ships with an escort of warships. convoy The warships **convoy**ed the merchant ships across the Pacific. Protection from harm. defence *Wire netting is the best defence against rabbits.* Protect or fight for as a champion. defend They were forced to **defend** for long periods. An organization of defenders that provides resistance against attack. defense A good boxer needs a good **defense**. Capable of being defended. defensible A morally **defensible** penal system. Escape potentially unpleasant consequences get away with a forbidden action. escape Their **escape** route. A person who cares for persons or property. **guardian** I am acting as **guardian** of my late brother s family. Use as a guide. quide A tour **quide**. A predatory mollusc with a squat heavy shell, which lives in tropical and helmet temperate seas. Preventing something from happening; restrictive. preclusive No **preclusive** action was taken.



preventive	Designed to keep something undesirable such as illness or harm from occurring. <i>Quinine was used as a malaria <b>preventive</b></i> .
probation	(law) a way of dealing with offenders without imprisoning them; a defendant found guilty of a crime is released by the court without imprisonment subject to conditions imposed by the court. <i>For an initial period of <b>probation</b> your manager will closely monitor your progress.</i>
protect	Use tariffs to favor domestic industry. Security products are designed to <b>protect</b> information from unauthorized access.
<u>protective</u>	Intended or adapted to afford protection of some kind. The use of <b>protective</b> masks and equipment.
<u>protector</u>	A person or thing that protects someone or something. A man who became her <b>protector</b> adviser and friend.
safeguard	Make safe. A framework which <b>safeguard</b> s employees from exploitation.
safely	In a way that is not likely to cause or lead to harm or injury. You can <b>safely</b> ignore that advice.
safety	The condition of being protected from or unlikely to cause danger, risk, or injury. <i>They should leave for their own</i> <b>safety</b> .
<u>secretive</u>	(of a person's expression or manner) having an enigmatic or conspiratorial quality. She was very <b>secretive</b> about her past.
<u>security</u>	Procedures followed or measures taken to ensure the security of a state or organization. The head of <b>security</b> was a former policeman.
sentry	A person employed to keep watch for some anticipated event. On <b>sentry</b> duty.
<u>shelter</u>	Provide shelter for. People were <b>shelter</b> ing under store canopies and trees.
tenable	(of an office, position, scholarship, etc.) able to be held or used. Such a simplistic approach is no longer <b>tenable</b> .
tutelar	Providing protective supervision; watching over or safeguarding. <i>Tutelary gods.</i>
<u>ward</u>	The grooves in the bit of a key that correspond to the wards in a lock. I saw them keeping <b>ward</b> at one of those huge gates.



watchman A man employed to look after an empty building, especially at night. A night watchman.
